




Grand River Conservation Authority Parks

Riverside Park

Riverside Park stretches along both banks of the Speed River creating one of Guelph's largest recreational greenspaces. One of the most prominent features in the park is the floral clock (it keeps time!) and the picturesque gardens that encompass it. The clock is one on the largest in Ontario. During the summer months, children can ride a restored musical carousel. The Riverside Express (a miniature train) or paddle boats. A scale model of the Priory (the first building in Guelph) will give visitors a taste of Guelph's past.

Covered Bridge

The town's Lattice Covered Footbridge was built in June 1992 near the junction of the Speed and Eramosa Rivers by 400 timberframers who were gathered in Guelph. Based on an original design from the 1800s, it is one of only two in all of Ontario. Compare it to the restored covered bridge in West Montrose a short drive north of Guelph off Elmira Road. York Rd. at Wyndham St. or Gordon St. at the Speed River.





GUELPH WALKABOUTS


The Guelph Walkabouts are short walking tours that highlight some of the outstanding heritage buildings and natural features in Guelph. Spend part of a day and stop at all the picturesque and magnificent surroundings. Both walkabouts have been marked out using the map on page 25. All points referred to have been marked with a bullet (•) on the map. Enjoy your Guelph experience!





Walking Back in Time (red trail)

Most of the points on our walk are buildings designated as being historically significant. These sites (and over fifty others) will have a prominently displayed brown oval plaque that tells their story. A journey through Guelph's history begins with a visit through the majestic Church of Our Lady. Around the corner at the Guelph Civic Museum discover the people and events that have shaped Guelph to the city it is at present. Guelph City hall is situated on Carden Street, which is the site of Guelph's original Market Place from 1827. Further along the street is the 6167 railway engine on the right. As you move along Macdonell Street toward the Speed River, watch for the Blacksmith Fountain on the left. Further along on the right, is the plague on the railway bridge abutment that signifies the founding of Guelph in 1827 with the felling of a maple tree. On Woolwich Street where the River Run Centre now stands is where Guelph's first building, a log structure





named the Priory, stood until 1926.
Follow the street past the former
Wellington County Courthouse along to
Douglas Street. Watch for a number of
designated buildings along the way and
make time to stop at one of the many
splendid cafes and bistros for a bite to eat.

Travelling the Trails and Parks (purple trail)

A trip through Guelph's glorious parks and gardens begins at the Covered Bridge, which spans the Speed River. Cross Gordon Street into Royal City Park, notice the circular garden to your right. Wander along the bank of the tranquil river through the park to Gow's Bridge, a small stone bridge crossing the water and watch for a designated plaque. Cross the bridge and walk up to McCrae House museum and the Col. John McCrae Memorial Gardens and their abundance of poppies. After a visit to the museum, walk along Water Street, turn right on Mary Street and left onto Albert Street, and then back to Gordon Street. (Watch for three designated heritage homes along the way.). Cross back over the river to the

Boathouse to relax in the tearoom for a meal and view the interpretive displays about the history of the Speed River or enjoy an ice cream on a summer day. Afterwards, take advantage of Guelph's Royal Recreation Trail and go for a walk along the Speed or Eramosa River. Entrances to the trail are across the Covered Bridge or across Gordon Street and to the right.
