PERMANENT settlement on anything like a large scale was not made in Western Canada—afterwards Upper Canada and now the Province of Ontario—until the War of the American Revolution drove the Loyalists in the revolting colonies to seek homes in the wilderness north of the Great Lakes, but a wilderness that was British territory. It was these loyalists and their descendants who converted that wilderness into the richest and most populous Province of our Dominion.

The first Loyalists to reach the eastern districts of the Province came in the summer of 1784, and settled along the northern bank of the St. Lawrence near Catarauqui—the site of old Fort Frontenac and of modern Kingston—and on the shores of the Bay of Quinte. According to a return signed by Sir John Johnson in 1784, these settlers numbered 1,563 men, 626 women, 1,492 children and 99 servants, a total of 3,776.

Of this eastern settlement Catarauqui became the principal place, and its loyal inhabitants changed the name to Kingston. The population of which in 1911, was 20,000.

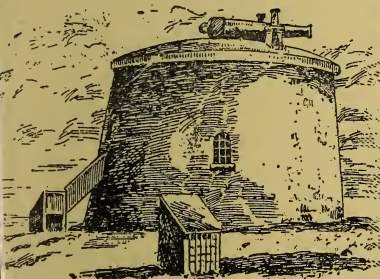

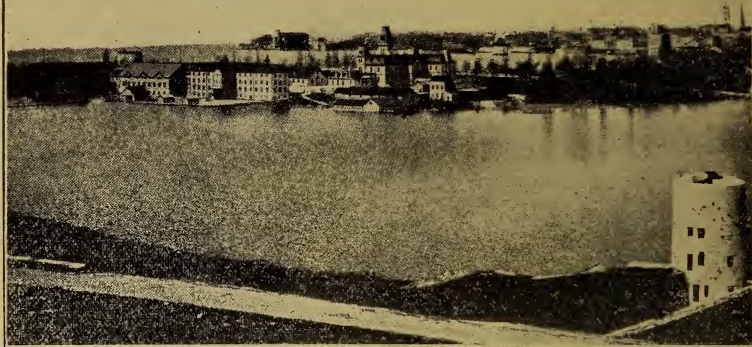

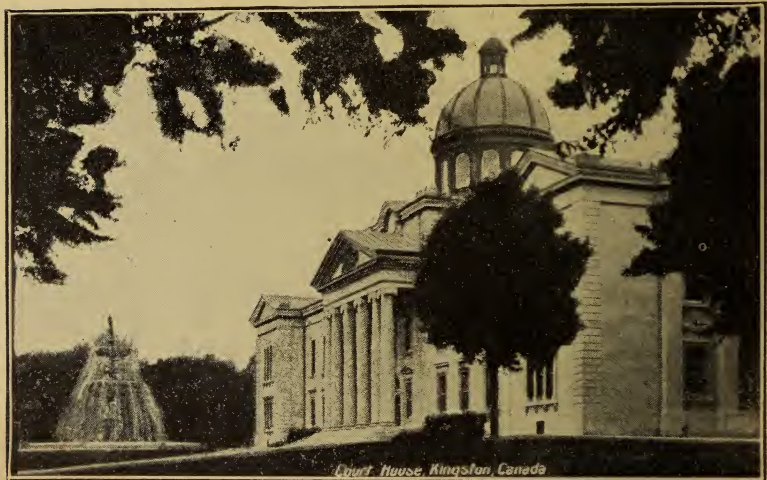
