THE OBJECTS.

Preserving the Martial Spirit, Language, Dress, Music, and Antiquities of the Ancient Caledonians.

- Rescuing from Oblivion the valuable Remains of Celtic Literature;
- The Establishment and Support of Schools in the Highlands of Scotland, and in other Parts of the British Empire;
- Relieving Distressed Highlanders, at a distance from their Native Homes; and
- Promoting the Improvement and General Welfare of the Northern Parts of the Kingdom.

CONSTITUTION.

1st, The Society consists of a President, Five Vice-Presidents, Three Treasurers, Three Auditors, Twelve Directors, Two Secretaries, a Deputy Secretary, Two Chaplains, and an indefinite number of Members.

2nd, Persons qualified for being proposed Members are Natives of the Highlands of Scotland,— Sons, or Descendants of Highlanders,—Proprietors of Lands in the Highlands,—Individuals who have done signal service to that part of the Kingdom,— Officers of Highland Corps,—and Husbands of Highland Ladies.

3rd, Twenty persons, and no more, may be elected *Honorary* Members, without possessing any of the foregoing qualifications; and Highland Ladies who are Chiefs of their respective Clans, are eligible.

4th, The affairs of the Society are managed by a Committee, consisting of a President, VicePresidents, Treasurers, Auditors, Directors, Secretaries, and Deputy-Secretary, for the time being, and of all those Members who have served the Office of President, Vice-President, Treasurer, or Secretary.

5th, All business must be first submitted to, and determined on, by the Committee of Management, their proceedings being afterwards subject to be confirmed or rejected by a General Court.

6th, No Bye-Law, Rule, or Ordinance, can be binding, or have any force or effect, until the same shall have been agreed to at a General Court, and confirmed by the next succeeding General Court, whether Quarterly or Extraordinary (except in the event of the sum to be paid by members on admission being reduced below the amount of Twelve Guineas, in which case the Resolution must be confirmed by the two next succeeding *regular* General Courts); and the same method must be observed in altering or repealing any such Bye-Law, Rule, or Ordinance.

7th, The Custody of the Common Seal, and the use and application thereof, can only be ordered and disposed of in a General Court. 8th, All Questions at any General Court, or Committee of Management, are to be decided by Vote; and in case of an equality of votes, the President, or Chairman, shall have the Casting Vote, except in the case of the election of Members, as hereafter mentioned.

GENERAL COURTS.

1st, A General Court of the Corporation shall be holden four times at least every year; that is to say, on the third Saturday in the month of February; the twenty-first day of March; the third Saturday in the month of April; and the third Saturday in the month of May; and in case the said twenty-first of March should happen to fall on a Sunday or Good Friday, then the said General Court shall be holden on the twentysecond; and notice of each such General Court shall be given in two of the Public Newspapers, ten days at least before the holding of every such Court. 2nd, Whenever occasion shall require, a Special General Court shall be holden by order of the Committee, or upon the requisition of any Nine of the Members, signified in writing to any one of the Secretaries for the time being, and subscribed by such Members, the like notice thereof being given.

3rd, The President, or in his absence one or more of the Vice-Presidents, Treasurers, or Auditors, with any Seven or more Members of the said Corporation, of whom Two at the least shall be Directors; or (in the absence of the President, all the Vice-Presidents, Treasurers, and Auditors) any Twenty or more of the Members of the said Corporation, of whom Three at the least shall be Directors, shall compose a General Court.

4th, The Four General Courts directed by the Act of Incorporation to be holden in each year, shall each be followed by a Dinner, which shall be considered a Public Meeting of the Society, and at which Visitors may be admitted. At each of those Meetings, so soon as a sufficient number of Members shall be present, the Court shall be opened, and the Business of the Day, if possible, disposed of before Dinner; but the whole or any part of such Business may, in the discretion of the Meeting, or as convenience shall dictate, be adjourned or deferred; and in the event of any Debate arising when Visitors are present, the President, or Chairman of the Meeting shall, in the exercise of his own discretion, and without any vote or discussion, have a power to adjourn the Question, and to give directions for summoning a Special General Court to decide the same; and all such General Courts (with the exception of that to be holden on the 21st of March) shall be imperatively closed at Eleven o'clock, P. M.

5th, At the General Court holden on the third Saturday in February, there shall be chosen, a President, Five Vice-Presidents, Three Treasurers, Three Auditors, Twelve Directors, Two Secretaries, One Deputy-Secretary, or Accountant, and Two Chaplains, to serve for the space of one year only, to commence from the 21st day of March then next ensuing; and in case any of the Offices aforesaid shall have become vacant by death, resignation or otherwise, another person shall be appointed by the Committee to serve in the place of such Officer, during the remainder of the term for which the person whose office shall have become vacant was chosen, and no longer. 6th, The General Meeting to be holden on the 21st of March in each year, to celebrate the Anniversary of the glorious BATTLE OF ALEXANDRIA, is the established Anniversary Festival of the Society; and the expenses thereof shall be defrayed by issuing Tickets of Admission, at a price to be regulated by the Committee; when the same shall happen to fall on a Sunday, the meeting shall be held on the Monday following.

7th, A Subscription shall be opened in each season, to defray the expense of the Dinners following the three General Courts in the months of April, May, and February; the amount of the subscription to be fixed by the Committee of Directors.

8th, At every General Meeting of the Society, each Member may introduce one or more Visitors, paying for his or their Tickets, at the same rate as that fixed for non-subscribing Members; but no person qualified for being proposed as a Member of the Society, shall be admitted as a Visitor oftener than once in the same year, unless he be a Candidate for admission.

9th, The reception and discussion of all Business

being delegated to the Committee of Management; subject to being reported to, and confirmed or rejected by, the General Court, no Business shall be proposed, discussed, or decided upon, at any General Court, excepting only the confirmation or rejection of the proceedings of the Committee, the Election of Officers, the disposal and application of the Common Seal, and the Proposition and Election of Members.

10th, As the preservation of the Garb of the Ancient Caledonians is one of the original and important objects of the Society, and as the general adoption thereof at Public Meetings would essentially tend to excite and preserve the National Spirit of Highlanders, which has been so conspicuously and so honourably displayed on all occasions, and in all parts of the world;—the Twelve Directors, and the Secretaries for the time being, are expected to appear in the Highland Garb at all General Courts; and it is earnestly recommended to all other Members of the Society, and especially to the President, and other Officers, to assume the distinguishing Garb of Highlanders, at all the Public Meetings of the Corporation.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMEN'T.

Ist, A Meeting of the Committee of Management (Five to be a quorum) shall be holden four times at least in every year, viz., on the first Saturday in the months of February, March, April, and May; and whenever occasion shall require, a Special Meeting shall be holden by order of any General Court, or upon the requisition of the President, or any Two of the Vice-Presidents, or Treasurers, or of any Five Members, signified in writing to any one of the Secretaries, and subscribed by such Officers or Members; and Notice of each such Meeting shall be given to every Member of the said Committee, five days at least before the holding of any such Meeting.

2nd, At the Annual Election of Officers, Four Members of the Committee of Directors for the preceding year shall be disqualified from being elected Members of the said Committee for the year ensuing; and those Four Members shall be such as, by reference to the Minutes, shall be found to have attended the smallest number of Meetings of the said Committee in the preceding year; and, after the lapse of one year, such Members shall again be eligible, and may be re-elected.

3rd. In order to obtain a regular attendance at the four regular Meetings of the Committee, they shall be followed by a Dinner; and for that purpose a Subscription shall be opened upon the Election of Officers in each year; each of the Three Treasurers, Three Auditors, and Twelve Directors shall, upon his Election, pay such amount as may be determined on, towards the expense of such Meetings, in full of all Charges and Demands attending the same; the other Officers of the Society, who are ex officio Members of the Committee, in their, or each of their option, may either subscribe or pay at each Meeting they may attend, such a sum as may be determined upon; and no further charge or expense shall be paid by any Officer of the Society attending the Meetings of the Committee; and all such Meetings shall be imperatively closed at Ten o'clock P.M.

To avoid the expense of ordering Dinner for a greater number than is necessary, the Members of the Committee are required to intimate their intention of attending or not, by Letter to the Secretary, the day before each Meeting, at the latest; or in default shall pay Five Shillings. Any Member engaging to attend, and not doing so, shall pay Ten Shillings; Dinner to be on Table at Six precisely; and any Gentleman appearing after that hour to be fined Two Shillings and Sixpence. All fines to be applied towards the general expenses of the Committee Meetings.

ELECTION OF MEMBERS.

1st, Persons desirous of becoming Members of this Society, shall be proposed at one of the General or Special General Courts, or at any Meeting of the Committee, by one Member of the Corporation, and seconded by another, who shall insert in a Book kept for that purpose, the name, qualification, and place of abode of such person, together with their own names; and each of the persons so proposed shall be severally put in nomination at the next ensuing General or Special General Court; and the Members then present shall proceed to a Ballot; and such persons shall be declared duly elected as shall appear to be approved of by three parts in four of the Members balloting; and shall,

before his admission, pay into the hands of one of the Treasurers of the Society, the sum of Twelve Guineas, as a Life-Subscription.

2nd, In case it shall be the unanimous desire of the Members present at such Election, that the Ballot should be dispensed with, and that the Person then in nomination should be elected a Member of the Society, such person so elected, shall be deemed and taken to have been elected by Ballot, and shall be admitted a Member, on payment of the sum aforesaid.

FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT.

1st, One-fifth of each future Life-Subscription shall be appropriated to the Hall Fund; the remaining sum to be added to the Permanent Funds of the Society: the Interest of which only shall be applicable to general purposes. Donations in aid of that Fund will be carried to that separate Account, and registered in the Names of the respective Donors.

2nd, In the beginning of every year, the Treasurers shall produce, for the information of the

Society, an Account of the Income and Expenditure of the preceding year, duly audited; an Account of the Life-Subscription collected, the portions thereof added to the Capital, and to the Hall Fund respectively, and the Donations made to the latter as a separate Account, with a General Statement of the Funds of the Corporation.

ESTABLISHMENT OF BRANCHES.

1st, For more effectually promoting the objects of the Society, and that the Natives of Scotland in general, and of the Highlands in particular, and those connected with Scotland by alliance, friendship, or otherwise, may cultivate an attachment to each other, and to their Parent Land, wherever they may happen to reside; Branches of the Society may be established in any of the British Settlements, and in any Foreign Country, where any number of Scotchmen are settled, by Commissions subscribed by the President and Secretary, and addressed to those who are the most likely to take a pride and pleasure in being connected with this Society, authorizing them to form such Branches, and to constitute them on principles

the best calculated to promote its objects, under the peculiar circumstances of each place.

2nd, To every such Branch, an Account of the Origin and Progress of the Society, the objects for which it was constituted, and the Rules by which it is governed will be transmitted, with such other information or papers as may, from time to time, be circulated among the Members.

3rd, Gentlemen admitted into the several Branches Abroad, on subscribing to the Rules, and contributing at once to the Fund of the Parent Society, the full Subscription of Twelve Guineas each, or Six Guineas Abroad, and Six Guineas additional on their arrival in London, shall become Members of the Society in London, and receive a Diploma accordingly.

INSTITUTED 24TH OCTOBER, 1820,

By virtue of a Commission from the Highland Society of London.

THE OBJECTS.

Preserving the Martial Spirit, Language, Dress, Music, and Antiquities of the Ancient Caledonians; Rescuing from Oblivion the valuable Remains of Celtic Literature; The Establishment and Support of Schools in the Highlands of Scotland, and in other Parts of the British Empire; Relieving Distressed Highlanders, at a distance from their Native Homes; and Promoting the Improvement and General Welfare of the Northern Parts of the Kingdom.

THE HIGHLAND SOCIETY

CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

1st, That the Society be called THE ABERDEEN HIGHLAND SOCIETY.

2nd, That the first object of this Society shall be, to promote the general use of the Ancient Highland Dress in the Highlands of Scotland; its views to be afterwards extended, as circumstances may admit, to other objects connected with the preservation of the characteristics of the Highlanders.

3rd, That the Office-bearers of the Society shall consist of a President, Five Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, Two Secretaries, an Auditor of Accounts, and Two Chaplains.

4th, That there shall be a Court of Directors, or Committee of Management, consisting of Twelve Members, besides the Office-bearers, who shall be, *ex officio*, Members of the Committee. Five Members to constitute a quorum; and the Committee to have the power of appointing a Substitute for any of their number that may be absent.

44

5th, That a Piper, and a messenger or Officer shall form part of the Establishment of the Society, with Salaries, and a Highland Dress to each, chargeable on the Funds.

6th, Persons qualified for being proposed Members of the Society, are, Natives of the Highlands of Scotland,—Sons, or descendants of Highlanders, Proprietors of Lands in the Highlands,—Individuals who have done signal service to that part of the Kingdom,—Officers of Highland Corps, and Husbands of Highland Ladies.

7th, Twenty persons, and no more, may be elected Honorary Members, without possessing any of the qualifications stated in the foregoing Rule.

8th, That the Members of the Parent Society shall, upon signifying their wish, be enrolled as Members of this Branch; having already paid their Admission Fee of Twelve Guineas, and received their Diploma.

9th, That Candidates for admission must be recommended by two Members who shall sign the recommendation. The admission shall be by Ballot, at General Meetings,—two-thirds of the Members present concurring in each admission, —and, for the purpose of balloting, a previous General Meeting shall be called a week before each of the stated General Meetings.

10th, That all Motions intended to be brought before the General Meetings, and all incidental Communications, shall, in the first instance, be transmitted to the Secretary, and by him laid before the Committee of Management, or Court of Directors, at their first subsequent Meeting, and the Court shall report their opinion to the next General Meeting, where the original Motion shall be finally decided on.

11th, That the Office-bearers shall be elected annually, at the stated General Meetings.

12th, That the Secretary shall keep a Minute and Letter Book, in which the Transactions of the Society shall be regularly entered.

OF ABERDEEN.

FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT.

13th, That each Member shall pay to the Treasurer One Guinea of Admission Money, and an Annual Contribution of Ten Shillings and Sixpence in advance. The Contribution Money to be redeemable by payment of Six Guineas; in which, if paid within two years after admission, may be included the first Annual Contributions.

14th, That the funds of the Society, after defraying incidental expenses, shall be applied to its specific objects, at such time, and in such proportion and manner, as the stated General Meetings shall direct.

15th, That the Treasurer shall open a Deposit Account with the Bank of Scotland, in the name of THE ABERDEEN HIGHLAND SOCIETY; and shall at no time retain in his hands any sum of the Society's Funds exceeding £25. No draft to be made on the Deposit Account, but by order of the Court of Directors; and the Treasurer's Draft to be countersigned by the Secretary.

REGULATIONS.

REGARDING THE MEETINGS OF THE SOCIETY.

16th, That there shall be two stated General Meetings of the Society annually; one on the 21st of March, the Anniversary of the BATTLE OF ALEX-ANDRIA, and the other in the month of September, immediately preceding the Races; at both of which the Society shall dine together.

17th, That at these Meetings the Members shall be dressed in the ancient Costume of the Highlanders of Scotland; each Member, if of any Clan, in its particular Tartan. Officers, Naval and Military, shall be entitled to attend in Uniform.

18th, That the stated Meetings of the Court of Directors shall be held Quarterly, viz., the second Tuesday of each Quarter; and as many intermediate Meetings may be held as by them shall be considered necessary.

19th, That it shall be the duty of the Court to

conduct the ordinary business of the Society, to audit annually, with the assistance of the Auditor, the Treasurer's Accounts (in regard to which, he of course can have no vote); to make the necessary arrangements for the General Meetings; and, in particular, to collect information as to the most eligible plan for carrying into effect the objects of the Institution; to digest the information received by them into regular Reports, and to lay them, along with a distinct state of the Funds, before each General Meeting.

THE OBJECTS.

Promoting the Improvement and General Welfare of the Northern Parts of the Kingdom.

CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

1st, That the Governor of Madras be President of the Society.

2nd, That the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and Puisne Judges, if Members of the Society, be Vice- Presidents.

3rd, That the Members of Council, if Members of the Society, be Vice-Presidents.

4th, That General Officers serving under this Presidency, be Vice-Presidents, if Members of the Society.

5th, That all Members of the Highland Society of London, when resident at Madras, be Vice-Presidents.

6th, The affairs of the Society to be managed by the Presidents, Two Vice-Presidents, a Committee of Six Directors, the Treasurer, and Secretary. 7th, All Business proposed for the consideration of the Society, to be discussed and determined on by the Committee of Management; but whose proceedings are subject to be afterwards confirmed or rejected by a General Meeting of the Members of the Society.

8th, Persons eligible to become Members of the Society are, Natives of Scotland in general, and of the Highlands in particular, Individuals who have done some signal service to that part of the Kingdom, Officers of Highland Corps, and husbands of Scottish Ladies.

9th, The qualifications of Candidates shall be written down by the Members who propose them; and the names of the Candidates so proposed, with those of their several proposers and seconders, shall be circulated with the Notices of the next Meeting of the Society, or of the Committee at which they are to be balloted for; provided always that Twelve Members are present at the ballot.

10th, At the last General Meeting of the Season, Candidates may be proposed and balloted for on the same day. 11th, In balloting, Two Black Balls shall exclude the Candidate.

12th, The Election of Officers, who shall previously be nominated by the Committee, shall take place in each year, at the General Meeting preceding the Anniversary, in order that they may, at the Anniversary, assume the Duties of the Offices to which they shall be respectively elected.

FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT.

1st, Every Member shall subscribe to the Rules of the Society on his Election, or at the next ensuing Meeting, and shall pay to the Treasurer Forty Pagodas for a Life Subscription, and Five for a Diploma.

2nd, The Subscriptions so received shall be transmitted to the Highland Society in London, to be applied by that Body for the purposes for which this Branch was instituted. A part, however, of the Subscriptions will be retained, to enable the Society to relieve distressed Highlanders at a dis-

tance from their homes, and to reward the gallant exploits of Highland Soldiers serving in India.

3rd, Members who may please to pay an Annual Subscription of Five Pagodas, instead of a Life Subscription, may continue to do so; and Members who may have been absent from India for several years, shall, on their return, be liable only to pay One Year's Subscription, in lieu of all demands whatever during their absence; or a Life Subscription of Forty Pagodas will be received as a commutation of all Arrears, under any circumstances.

4th, All Donations to the Society, and Bequests by Will, shall be kept distinct in the name of the person so contributing, to augment the Funds, and shall be exclusively appropriated, if so bequeathed, to any specific object fixed on by the generous Donor.

5th, In the beginning of every year, the Treasurer shall produce, for the information of the Society, an Account of the Expenditure of the preceding year, duly audited; and an Account of the Life and Annual Subscriptions collected and transmitted to the Secretary of the Society in London.

REGULATIONS.

REGARDING THE MEETINGS OF THE SOCIETY.

1st, The Society shall hold an Anniversary Meeting in every year, on the 21st day of March, to celebrate the Anniversary of the glorious BATTLE OF ALEXANDRIA; and when the same shall happen to fall upon a Sunday, the Meeting shall be held on the Saturday preceding, or the Monday following it.

2nd, Besides the Anniversary, there shall be a Meeting held on St. Andrew's Day.

3rd, The Expense of these Meetings will be defrayed by the Subscribers in equal shares ; and the Secretary and Treasurer will collect the amount from the Members of the Society.

4th, At every General Meeting, and at the Anniversary, each Member may introduce one Visitor; but no Scotchman shall be admitted, unless he be a Candidate for admission.

5th, No Business shall be discussed or decided

upon at any General Meeting, excepting only the confirmation or rejection of the Proceedings of the Committee, and the Proposition and Election of Members.

6th, In the event of any Debate arising when Visitors are present, the President, or Chairman of the Meeting, shall, in the exercise of his own discretion, have a power to adjourn the Question, and give directions for calling a Special General Meeting to decide the same.

7th, At every Meeting of the Society, excepting the Anniversary, the first business shall be to read the Proceedings of the former Meeting, in order that the same may be confirmed or rejected, as the case may be.

8th, As the general adoption of the Garb of the Ancient Caledonians, at the General Meetings of the Society, would tend to excite and preserve the National Spirit of Highlanders, which has been so conspicuously and so honourably displayed in all parts of the world; it is earnestly recommended to all Members to whom it may be convenient, to appear at the several General Meetings of the Society in the Highland Dress. 9th, Diplomas will be sent to all the Members of this Branch of the Highland Society, who have become Life Subscribers; and such Members shall become Members of the Society itself, upon their arrival in London, paying the additional sum of Two Guineas, and subscribing to the Rules of the Society.

By virtue of a Commission from the Highland Society of London.

THE OBJECTS.

Preserving the Martial Spirit, Language, Dress, Music, and Antiquities of the Ancient Caledonians;

Rescuing from Oblivion the valuable Remains of Celtic Literature;

The Establishment and Support of Schools in the Highlands of Scotland, and in other parts of the British Empire;

Relieving Distressed Highlanders, at a distance from their Native Homes; and

Promoting the Improvement and General Welfare of the Northern Parts of the Kingdom, and of the Highland settlements in Canada.

CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

1st.—The Governor-General of British North America, for the time being, to be respectfully requested to become Chief.

2nd.—The Society to consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, one Treasurer, two Auditors, twelve Directors, one Secretary, and an indefinite number of Members.

3rd.—Persons eligible to be proposed Members of the Society shall be Highlanders and their descendants; individuals who have rendered essential service to Highlanders; Officers of Highland Corps, Regular or Militia, and Husbands of Highland Ladies.

4th.—Twelve persons, and no more, may be elected Honorary Members, without possessing any of the qualifications mentioned in the foregoing rule.

5th.—The affairs of the Society to be managed by a Committee, consisting of the President, Treasurer, Auditors, Directors, and Secretary, for the time being, three of whom shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.

6th.—All business proposed for the consideration of the Society, shall first be discussed and determined on by the Committee of Management, which shall always meet previous to any General Court; but whose proceedings must be approved of by the next General Court before they shall be binding, or have effect.

7th.—All questions upon the proceedings of the Society, at any General Court or Committee of Management, shall be decided by vote; and in case of an equality of votes, the President, or Chairman, to have the casting vote, save and except in the election of Members, as hereafter mentioned.

GENERAL COURTS.

1st.—A General Court of the Society shall be holden at least three times a year; that is to say, on the third Monday in December; on the second Wednesday in January, and on the eighteenth day of June; and in case the eighteenth day of June should fall upon a Sunday, then, and in that case, it shall be holden on the nineteenth, the day immediately following.

2nd.—When occasion shall require, a Special General Court may be holden by order of a majority of the Committee; or upon the written requisition of any five Members of the Society, addressed to any of the Office-Bearers or Directors, giving five days' notice of such meeting; but a General Court convened on any notice, shall be considered a regular Court of the Society.

3rd.—The President, one or more Vice Presidents, the Treasurer, Secretary, with six Members, or, in the absence of the President, Vice Presidents, Treasurer, and Secretary, eight members, one of whom shall be a Director, shall form a General Court.

4th.—The President, Vice Presidents, Treasurer, Auditors, Directors, and Secretary, shall be elected annually at the General Court on the third Monday in December, and they shall continue in office until the third Monday in December following, inclusive.

5th.—The General Court to be holden on the 18th of June in each year, being intended to celebrate the Anniversary of the glorious battle of OF CANADA.

Waterloo, shall be considered the Anniversary festival of the Society: and the expenses thereof shall be defrayed by issuing tickets of admission at a price not to exceed Fifteen Shillings.

6th. — Every Member residing within the Eastern District who does not intend to be present at the Anniversary festival on the eighteenth day of June, shall signify such his intention to the Secretary, and enclose his annual subscription, post paid, or by private conveyance, at least a fortnight before that day; and thus save the expense of ordering dinner for a greater number than is necessary; otherwise he shall be subject to pay a fine of Five Shillings, as the Committee, taking it for granted that he intends to be present, will order dinner for him.

7th.—The General Court to be holden on the second Wednesday in January, shall be followed by the Annual Ball, the expenses of which are to be defrayed in like manner as above.

8th.—As the general adoption of the Garb of the ancient Caledonians, at the General Courts of the Society, would tend to excite and preserve the national spirit of Highlanders, which has been so conspicuously and honourably displayed in all parts of the world; it is earnestly recommended to all Members, to whom it may be convenient, to appear at the several General Courts of the Society in the Highland Dress; and all Members of the Society are directed to wear a plaid of whatever Tartan they may please, at every General Court.

ELECTION OF MEMBERS.

1st.—Persons desirous of becoming Members of the Society, shall be proposed at one of the General Courts of the same, and elected by a ballot; and such person shall be excluded as shall appear to have had three black balls placed against his name.

2nd.—All Members of the Parent Society shall, on their arrival in Canada (if they desire it), be considered Members of this Branch during their residence in Canada, paying the annual subscription of Five Shillings.

3rd.—In case it shall be the unanimous desire of the Members present, at any election of Members, that the ballot should be dispensed with

and that the person then in nomination should be elected a Member of the Society, such person so elected shall be deemed and taken to have been elected by ballot, and shall be admitted a Member.

FINANCIAL DEPARTMENT.

1st.—Every Member shall pay a yearly subscription of Five Shillings, or in lieu thereof a life-subscription of Three Pounds, and every Member on his admission shall pay the sum of Five Shillings as an entrance fee.

2nd.—The interest only of the Life-Subscriptions shall be applicable to the purposes of the Society.

3rd.—The Auditors are to receive and audit all Accounts, and to give orders for the payment of such as they approve of, on the Treasurer, who shall pay them in the order in which they are presented; they are likewise to examine the Treasurer's Books at least once in every year.

4th.—There shall be three Solicitors to the Society, who shall reside within the Eastern District.

ESTABLISHMENT OF BRANCHES.

For more effectually promoting the objects of the Society, and that Highlanders and their descendants, and those connected with Scotland by alliance, friendship, or otherwise, may cultivate an attachment to each other and to their Parent land, wherever they may happen to reside; Branches of the Society shall be established wherever any number of Scotchmen are settled in Canada, by directions to those who are most likely to take a pride and pleasure in being connected with this Society, authorizing them to form such Branches, at the head of which they shall be placed by this Society as Vice Presidents, and to constitute them on principles the best calculated to promote the objects of the Society, under the peculiar circumstances of each place.

That the Scottish population be encouraged to form themselves into Branch Societies, in connection with this Society, so as to keep up a correspondence, communicate their wants, and

form an united and effective system, and that the Annual Subscription in such Branch Societies be not less than Two Shillings and Sixpence for each Member.

That the Office Bearers be authorized to frame Bye-laws for regulating the Meetings and Business of the Society, subject to the approval of the Society at the next Quarterly Meeting.

That the Office Bearers of the Society on all public occasions, and such of the Members as may think proper, shall wear scarfs of the Highland Tartan; that of the Office Bearers to be of the Tartan that may be selected by the Society.
