









The three top seals of the other page, the first one from left to right!

- 1. 1783 Half size Great seal.
- 2. top middle seal is the Dorsett Seal, Mount Vernons, GW Presidential seal
- 3. the seal with the orange back ground is located at the National Archives, the National Archives, provides no information to this seal existing or what it was or who used it? Clearly who ever cast this seal you can see cast the half size seal before they were engraved or pierced.
- 4. The Great seal in the black and white image is a seal documented to have been misplaced "word for Word" from the US State Department in the 1800's, more like after 1900! This image has been used in the Eage and Sheild book and in the Dr, Heronimus great seal book he published.
- 5. The middle lower seal image, is the Mississippi Territorial seal of 1798.
- 6. The bottom right page image show the National Archives Great Seal that is promoted by the National Archives as such, the original 1782, 1st Great Seal. Which the seal is not, they also tell that the seal is not a seal with the Reverse coat of arms of the United States, being the Pyramid. You can clearly see the seals back side edge, shows that is has a seal attached. Knights Templar where the first to use double sided seals as far as I know.
