NEW SOURCE FOUND FOR BONNETS

Our friend Brian Carpenter of Clan Donnachaidh has sent us the following information about an historically accurate bonnet. He writes, "No longer do we have to order from the U.K. - and/or pay an arm and a leg! - for correct Scots bonnets of the Jacobite and F&I War periods. Now there is a new N. American source offering fine hand-knitted and felted bonnets, and at a great price, too!"

"Diane Jensen of Boise, ID, is a professional knitter now making these reproductions, and she has been guided in deriving a correct pattern by yours truly. I have received one of the prototypes, and a very fine bonnets it is! It is of the proper size and configuration for our period: 12 inch diameter with a narrow headband. The knitting/felting is tight and dense, making these practically waterproof. Altogether a superior Scots bonnet!"

"Solid colored bonnets in shades of traditional blue, or other natural colors, are only \$45.00, shipping included to U.S. addresses."

For those of you who've always thought Scotch Bonnets were just a type of flower, I've got news for you. They're hats too. Lovely felted wool hats. Think tam-o-shanter or beret on steroids. These babies are lovely, almost completely waterproof, and much softer than wool has any right to be. They were the hat of choice for Scots fighting in the '15, the '45, the French and Indian War, and even the American Revolution. Sadly, these bonnets are now pretty tough to find in this country, especially hand-made, as they should be to be authentic, and in any variety of colors or sizes.
