



Our Dad's and uncles are remembered more fervently by Europeans than by a lot of Americans!! The audience in the street paid rapt attention!

About six miles from Maastricht, in the Netherlands, lie buried 8,301 American soldiers who died in "Operation Market Garden" in the battles to liberate Holland in the fall/winter of 1944. Every one of the men buried in the cemetery, as well as those in the Canadian and British military cem-

eteries, has been adopted by a Dutch family who mind the grave, decorate it, and keep alive the memory of the soldier they have adopted. It is even the custom to keep a portrait of "their" soldier in a place of honour in their home.

Annually, on "Liberation Day," memorial services are held for "the men who died to liberate



clude refining the policies associated with the Society's scholarship program. Resolution 2022-2 was recently passed and is available on our website for your review. Its purpose is to more clearly define the goals and objectives of the Society on the one hand while providing more flexibility to the Youth Scholarship Committee on the other. There will be a new application form developed shortly and will be available before the Calendar Year is over. Applications will be received between Jan 1 and April 1. Please read the Resolution carefully. Another key decision was to continue to fund the Scholarship program via operational funds and invest contributions to the scholarship program in order to develop a self-sustaining scholarship program in the future. Thirdly, a decision was made to develop an AGM steering committee to identify the time and place for the next AGM and to consider decoupling the Executive Board Meeting. The goal is to ensure the AGM is held at a time and place more conducive for an end-of-year decision-making event while allowing the Executive Board Meeting more flexibility to encourage greater in-person participation. Other decisions were made that can be reviewed on our website at <clanhendersonscociety.com>. It is the best means to stay informed about your Society's activities and policies.

As this is my final address as President, I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for your tremendous support during the past four years.

We've made a lot of progress, but as is always the case, there is still a lot more to do. Since becoming a member of Clan Henderson Society and initially being appointed Mid East Regional Commissioner, I have had the pleasure of serving under the previous Presidents; Rex Maddox, Billy Henderson, Larry Henderson, and Tom Hendrix. Holland." The day concludes with a concert. The final piece is always "Il Silenzio," a memorial piece commissioned by the Dutch and first played in 1965 on the 20th anniversary of Holland's liberation. It has been the concluding piece of the memorial concert ever since.

This year the soloist was a 13-year-old Dutch girl, Melissa Venema, backed by André Rieu and his orchestra (the Royal Orchestra of the Netherlands). This beautiful concert piece is based upon the original version of taps and was composed by Italian composer Nino Rossi.







It was a beautiful day. The temperature was in the mid 80's with a nice breeze.



This year the Fresno Games had a whisky tasting and it sold out for both sessions.



We will continue to attend several more Highland Games and be there to help Clan Henderson at the event. We will also be able to see a lot more Highland Games activities.





Mary Frederica Rhinelander McCarl, independent historian and artist, died of heart failure on June 7, 2021 at her home in Gloucester, Mass., at age 81. Her articles on colonial New England include histories of Salem's witchcraft crisis (1692) and medical knowledge. She also worked as a librarian, an archivist, and a genealogist. She documented her own descent from Alexander and Eliza Hamilton and the entwined Rhinelander/Hamilton families of nineteenth-century New York, including Metropolitan Museum cofounder Frederic William Rhinelander.

Born on May 3, 1940, in Abington, Pennsylvania., to Constance Templeton Rhinelander and Frederic William Rhinelander, M.D., she came of age in Boston.

A proud graduate of the Winsor School for girls in 1957, she graduated magna cum laude from Radcliffe College in 1961. In addition to her three master's degrees, she completed the coursework fortwo doctorates: the first in medieval studies in the 1960s at Harvard, and the second in the *His*-

tory of the Book program at Boston University.

Her first marriage, to John S. C. Morgan, ended in divorce.

Preceding her in death are her parents; her brother, John B. Rhinelander; and her stepdaughter, Kathy Maisel. She is survived by her husband, Henry N. McCarl; her daughter, Francesca Morgan, of Evanston, Ill.; two stepchildren, Patricia McCarl of Atlanta and Fred McCarl of Oneonta, Ala.; two brothers, Frederic W. T. Rhinelander and David H. Rhinelander, and sister-in-law Jeanne C. Rhinelander, all of Gloucester; ten grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren.

Her family held a memorial service in Gloucester in September, 2021 at St.John's Episcopal Church where she and Henry McCarl were married in 1987.
