President's Message

Greetings Clan Members,

It has been a cold winter but spring is in the air.

Tom McLachlan, our Sennachie Emeritus, passed away recently. On behalf of all Canadian members I sent our deep condolences to Peter, Janet and the rest of Tom's family. Tom had formed a special relationship with Canada and visited every year for about 25 years.,

I am one of the few remaining members of the original group, who joined the Society when formed in 1979. The British Society was centered around Strathlachlan and seemed content to remain so. CMANA (Clan MacLachlan Association of North America) was established before the UK Society. Tom was the missionary, who carried the flag to different countries. Tom introduced me to Dame Marjorie (our former chief), who expressed a desire to have one worldwide Clan Society with branches in different regions and countries.

In Canada, we established a Maritimes Branch, a Central Canadian Branch, and a Pacific N.W. Branch. There was already a Western U.S.A. Branch, which had split recently from CMANA and wished to be part of the overall Society. Tom and I worked with Herb Jacobs, the President of CMANA, so that CMANA could become a Branch of the Society. On Tom's watch, the Society was transformed from a Society based in the British Isles, to a global Society with branches in many parts of the world.

At that time, an important objective for the members was tracing their genealogy back to roots in Scotland and Ireland. Tom tried to produce a family history for each member. This was one of the attractions of joining the Society.

Tom's records were a source of information to provide a family tree for members of the Clan. Now a great deal of this information is available on the internet, but Tom's records are valuable in giving personal background of people he had researched. Tom told me 20 years ago that he wished to live to 90. He made his goal, but in the last year or two, his ability to research was curtailed.

Anything written by Tom has been included in the Lachlan Library which is available through Membership in the Canadian Branch. His records in card form have been left to the Society. A lasting tribute to Tom would be to have this information digitized.

On a personal note it has taken me about 15 months to recover from my last cancer surgery. I hope that I am now on the mend and can devote more time to the Clan. I welcome Member 5215 Richard McLauchlan, and his wife Brenda, who are working together as our joint Membership Secretary. I hope we can tackle the problem of declining membership.

I wish all members and their families a rewarding Spring and Summer.

We are very sorry to announce that Tom McLachlan, family historian, and Clan Sennachie, passed away on January 4th, 2019, in England.

He was not only our Clan MacLachlan Sennachie, but also a personal friend, whom we had hosted at our home in Toronto on several occasions, and visited with him and his wife Evelyn in England as well. Tom travelled the world, personally visiting with as many MacLachlans as he could, researching and recording their stories on behalf of our clan.

I will remember both Tom and Evelyn for some time, as they stayed with us here in Toronto on several occasions, and we visited them in England too. Tom and Evelyn sang in a local choir for many years as well. My wife, Judy, especially recalls the enthusiasm with which Tom engaged in Scottish Country Dancing — especially "Strip the Willow", in which her feet actually left the floor! I was always impressed at Tom's physical endurance, as when he took me on one of his daily walks in England - and it turned out to be many miles, over a couple of hours, before we returned home!

Tom was chairman of the Omnibus Society in the 1980s, and was best known as general manager of Grey-Green, one of London's premier coach operators. Tom worked for Grey-Green for 36 years and was very highly regarded by everyone who knew him; he became very much an 'elder statesman' of the industry as a whole. He was a true gentleman who commanded real respect. Even after Tom retired, he was still very much interested in buses, and the bus industry, in all parts of the world. So much did his fascination carry over, that on several occasions while visiting in Canada and the USA, Tom would take lengthy bus trips (even when he could fly to his destination much more quickly), so he could enjoy continuing to be a part of this industry, as well as enjoying the scenery as the miles rolled by!

The last time we saw Tom was at Castle Lachlan in 2014, and he still was in fine form. We had a good conversation with him, and his son Peter at that time (see the photo on the next page). His passing means that we are all getting older - we just hope that more wisdom accompanies the years as we do so!



Old Scottish Words – of that Ilk

Sc. 1935 Scots Mag. (March) 405:

Lairds were designated by their Christian names and the title of their lands, which last name usually became the family surname, but since Scots Law required that every landowner be designated by his fief, when surnames became usual, cadets added the name of their estates to the family surname derived from the chief's estate, while the chief himself simply repeated the fief name which had also become his patronymic, and thus the title *dominus ejusdem*, or "of that ilk," came to indicate the head of a family. . . . He who was "Maclachlan" at home became "Maclachlan of that ilk" on formal occasions and in public assemblies, and this practice was recognised in Crown charters as early as 1529. The words "of that ilk" are in practice restricted to the chief and his heir, wives and daughters being designated as "Mrs. Maclachlan of Maclachlan" or "Miss Maclachlan of Maclachlan ."
