## 'Ben Usinger's Many Cars' by Gary Usinger

When I saw that this month's newsletter was to feature the spouses of **Shirley Usinger** and **Sonny Schindler**. I thought, what can I write about my Dad. He is a very generous and honest man who has lived his life helping others. He has made our life much easier and these days he donates much of his time to help his local volunteer fire department. An interesting thing about **Ben Usinger** is that he has had in excess of 60 vehicles during his 80 years. He always sold every one for more than what they cost him.

My Dad was born in St. Louis in 1924. He left there when he was 21, and at that time he had purchased more cars than his father had owned his whole life. His first was a 1935 Ford coupe, then a '39 Chevy coupe, a '38 Chevy convertible and a 1940 Studebaker sedan. He left for New Orleans where he worked for NCR for 35 years, married my Mom, and raised me. When he first moved, he had a '40 Ford convertible, then purchased a new 1948 Ford 2-door se-

dan, and after that, a new 1949 2-door Hudson. Then I showed up, along with a '31 Model A, a 1941 Ford 2-door sedan, and a 1950 Olds. Then there was a huge 1952 Studebaker 4-door Land Cruiser that my Mom couldn't drive, so it was soon replaced with a '49 Pontiac convertible, that was followed by a 1947 Mercury convertible and two Oldsmobiles (a 1951 "98", and a 1949 coupe).

I remember one day my Dad came home with a 1938 Cadillac 7-passenger limousine. He paid \$ 75 for it and soon afterwards, sold it for \$ 150. He should have keep that one. Today I saw one for sale on the internet for \$70,000. After the limo, came a '55 Dodge sedan, a 1952 Kaiser sedan (anyone remember Kaisers), and a 1955 Olds "98" coupe. Then came the lavender 1957 Caddy (actually they called it Amethyst), a '57 Ford Fairlane 500, a '64 Chevy Malibu, two 1961 Chevys (a 2-door and a 4-door) and two Ford panel trucks (a '55 and a '57). After the trucks, came two Chevy wagons (a '59 and a '61), then a 1952 Chevy 2 door sedan and a 1960 Ford T-bird with red leather seats.

Around this time, we built a new home with a double car garage and a double wide driveway which was soon filled with a '59 Chevy 2-door, a '65 Cadillac Coupe Deville, my grandmother's '62 Oldsmobile (which my Dad still has) along with another 1963 Olds sedan. One day I spotted a pink 1960 Willys Jeep and sure enough, it found a spot in our drive-

way. I had a great time with that Jeep (it's still in my Dad's garage). Then there was a 1962 Ford T-bird, a '66 Chevy wagon, and another Caddy (a 1966 Sedan Deville). Along came two more Fords ( a 1963 2-door Falcon and a 1968 4-door Fairlane 500) followed by a 1960 Chevy Impala and a 1966 GMC pick-up. Then my Dad got two '68 Ford wagons (a Falcon and a Fairlane), and after that, a 1967 Buick sedan, one more GMC (a '79 ½ ton), another Buick (a 1977 Skylark hatchback) and one more Caddy. This time it was a 1972 Sedan Deville.

I went off to college and my Dad got three station wagons ( a '73 Chevy Chevelle and two '72 Ford Torinos). Then came a 1967 Mercury sedan and a 1972 Olds "98". I moved out west and my Dad continued to accumulate cars. There was the '81 Isuzu pick-up and a 1982 Ford ½ ton. In 1988, he purchased a new GMC ½ ton pick-up and a new 1988 Ford Crown Victoria. In 1990, he bought a new GMC ½ ton and in 1992, a new Toyota Camry. Since then he has gotten a 1997 Ford F-150 4x4 and a 2000 Ford F-250 4x4.

During his life, he also bought and sold an additional 40+ cars and trucks to make extra money, but never actually used them as his own. This brings the total number of cars that he has owned in his lifetime to more than 100.




