



At its September meeting, your Board of Directors approved an annual donation of the dollar equivalent of £200 annually for five years to be given to the Wallace700 Association of Aberdeen Scotland. The contribution is in accordance with the Society articles of incorporation and by-laws. In 2005 Society members who attended the Gathering in Scotland participated in the Wallace Commemoration Ceremony in Aberdeen and were very impressed with the Association's professionalism and the dignity surrounding the commemoration activities. The president

of our Society is a trustee of the Wallace 700 Association.

One of the suggestions Richard Wallace received from responses to the 2007 membership survey was that the Society institute an "Ask The Board" program to provide a mechanism for members to query the board about Society business. 

CWSW CONTRIBUTES TO CULLODEN BATTLEFIELD MEMORIAL PROJECT



Since Clan Wallace visited Culloden during the 2005 Gathering, much has changed. The National Trust for Scotland has built a new modern Visitors Center and made changes to the battlefield markers to reflect results of new research into the last battle between armies in the United Kingdom. Part of the battlefield renovation is a new walkway leading to the center. The walkway is being paved with commemorative Caithness granite stones quarried from the north of Scotland.

The Trust needs to raise £1.95 million (\$3.6m) to complete this world-class Visitor Center and walkway. Individuals and organizations are purchasing the commemorative stones to assist in completing the project. At the CWS September 2007 Annual Directors Meeting, the Board discussed whether the Society should purchase a paving stone, and if yes, which stone to purchase.

All Directors agreed that purchasing a paving stone would personify the objectives of the Societies Articles of Incorporation, wherein our contribution will help keep alive an important piece of Scottish history.

The paving stone will be 600mm x 600mm in size, and similar to the photo. To envision 'our' stone, picture the National Trust symbol replaced with the Wallace Clan Badge with the following text:

**CLAN WALLACE
SOCIETY
WORLDWIDE**

Each line of text is limited to 16 characters including spaces and punctuation.

As I hear from the National Trust when the stone has been engraved and when it has been installed I will pass the information along in the newsletter and on the CWS website.





Capt. C. Wister Wallace


In 1907, Captain C. Wister Wallace, CSA, donated \$15,000 to establish the Public Library in Fredericksburg, VA, site of a major battle during the Civil War.

Five thousand dollars and one year later, the 37,000 square foot library building was completed, fully paid for and insured.

An initial stock of books recommended by a committee appointed by the presidents of the University of Virginia, Washington & Lee University, Richmond College and Macon College. They cost all of \$5000. Captain Wallace's last \$5000 was set aside for future book purchases.

Long time stalwart of the Society, Tom Wallace of Lower Sackville, Nova Scotia, is retiring from active duty with the Society. But don't think you have

heard the last of Tom as he is still very active in Scottish culture and heritage.

Tom organized and hosted the first Clan Wallace Society Gathering in Halifax, Nova Scotia, in 1999. Tom has served two terms on your Board of Directors, and has served as Editor between 2000 and 2006.

He created the current format of our award winning quarterly newsletter, *The Guardian*.

Most recently Tom has acted as the Advisory Director for Canada while concurrently assisting Jim Marcus in publishing the newsletter. Tom has asked to retire from active duty effective the first of the year 2008 due to his workload.

In 2006, Tom was elected President of the Federation of Scottish Clans in Nova Scotia (www.scotsns.ca), an organization that is working to revitalize the International Gathering of the Clans and make it again a major Scottish cultural event for North America.

He will continue to represent Clan Wallace at the Council of the Federation of Scottish Clans.

In addition Tom will be starting graduate school at Université Sainte-Anne in January 2008.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE 2007 ANNUAL
BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
Williamsburg, VA

Thursday 27 September 2007

I. Opening

President Bill Wallace opened the 2007 Annual Directors Meeting (ADM) of the Clan Wallace Society Worldwide at 12:17 PM. The following Board Members were present: William J. Wallace, John R. Wallace, Robert B. Wallace, Wayne Jones, Marcus J. Wallace, Jean R. Wallace, Lisa Deiss, Jim "Bowie" Wallace (arrived late). Elmer Inman gave his proxy to Bill Wallace, and Kay Cayler gave her proxy to John Wallace.

II. Reading of the 2006 Minutes

The Minutes of the 2006 ADM were approved.

III. Treasurer's 2007 Financial Report

The Treasurer's Financial Report for the year ending 30 September 2007 was presented and approved.

IV. Committee Reports

Elections and Ballot Committee for 2007. Since there were only three nominations received for the three open Director positions from the Nomination Ballots mailed out July of 2007, there was no need for the general election. An election notification letter was mailed to Council Members in September.

Membership Chairman Report. Charles Wallace announced that we had a total of 44 new members: 7 Life, no Council, and 37 Annual for the year 2007. The Board approved the report.

Newsletter Manager's Report: Wayne Jones presented the for Elmer Inman. His report gave the total operational cost of \$1,451.60. The report was approved.

Convenor Affairs Report: Jean Wallace reported that we have one new Convenor for the year. We have printed 50 copies of all four Clan Wallace books the Society sells during this year and restocked Convenor Kit supplies. The report was approved.

Secretary's Report: Wayne Jones presented the for Kay Cayler. The primary activities preformed this year were the mailing of the Nomination Ballots, the Election Notifica-

tion Letter, and the first Annual Presidents Letter to all Council Members. The report was approved.

Documents & Publications: Marcus Wallace reported that the translation of the Maitland Papers has halted due to the poor eyesight of the translator. With 10% of the book translated, Marcus and Jean are looking for a new translator for the book and have one prospect - a Latin professor at Baylor. Reimbursement will be considered. The report was approved.

Recognition Program John Wallace reported the fiscal status of the Rewards Program to date is \$16,550.00 income, with an initial outlay of \$3,367.00. The report was approved.

Director of Special Projects Report Wayne Jones reported that The Master Membership Database (MMD) Reconciliation Project resulted in the number of missing members being reduced from 213 to 140. He recommended, the deletion of missing and deceased members be discontinued, and that only one list be used regardless of member status. The report was approved.

Survey of New Members Richard Wallace conducted a random sample of 100 members going back to 2005. The survey contained five items to identify what members would not change, what members would change or improve, and what benefits were most important in their decision to become members of CWS. Comments and suggestions were solicited on other areas of CWS activities, as was new address information. Two benefits most liked were the newsletters and fellowship. Suggested improvements included more historical articles and another Scotland tour.

A recommendation was made to do a 2008 survey using members before 2005. Dick will conduct the survey. Another recommendation was to add an "Ask the Board" article to the newsletter with questions going to the President, who will pass the question on to the Board. All questions will be answered either directly or in subsequent newsletters. The Board accepted both recommendations.

V. Unfinished Business from 2006

The Board verified and ratified CWSW Business conducted by e-mail since the

2006 ADM. A synopsis of online business conducted follows:

- Policy with respect to donations that would benefit an individual member
- Closed the Braveheart poster action (discontinue using Mel Gibson poster)
- Closed the Action to produce the educational presentation
- Decision to provide free books for new Life and Council Memberships
- Provide 100 years young Edith T. (Wallace) Harris with a complimentary Life Membership

VI. The Harper's, Wayne Jones, Jim "Bowie" Wallace and Marcus Jim Wallace have all agreed to assist new Crawford Convenors. Bill also hopes to be able to work with the Murray's or Douglas's in the future.

The meeting was closed 3:50 PM by President Bill Wallace.

The Board voted to post Board Member Terms of Office on the CWS Web Site for online access by members.

Bob Wallace presented his report on the 2009 Gathering Site Selection with the recommended sites. The report was accepted and approved. After extended discussion, Jim "Bowie" Wallace made a motion to hold the Gathering at Estes Park, with the ADM being held immediately before the Gathering. This motion was approved.

Jean Wallace presented information on sites suitable for the Location for the 2008 ADM. After extended discussion, John Wallace made a motion that we choose Boise, ID, which was approved.

Potential CWSW Projects in Scotland. John Wallace contacted the proper authorities to get the repairs done on the Fence Wall at Robroyston Monument, and finally got the authorities to respond. They have done a tremendous amount of work in the area and have monies set aside for the repairs; they will do the project whether or not we donate to the cause. A motion was made that we continue to negotiate with the Glasgow Council to identify work which a donation of the equivalent of 500 Pounds Sterling, would accomplish, and to determine how the Society will be recognized. The motion was approved.

Aberdeen, Scotland. Since Wallace's execution anniversary is now commemorated annually in Aberdeen, John made the suggestion that we donate to their committee for projects that support the commemoration. Wayne Jones made a motion for the Society to donate 200 Pounds Sterling each year for the next 5 years from the President's Discretionary Fund (PDF), and to revisit the donation every 5 years. The PDF budget will be adjusted accordingly. The proposal was approved.

The Culloden Visitor Center is selling stones as a fundraiser to complete a walkway. Charles Wallace made a motion for the Society to purchase a stone for the amount of approximately \$3,000.00. The motion was approved.

Newsletter Input Cutoff Dates Winter 11/24/07; Spring 2/24/08; Summer 5/24/08; and Fall 8/24/08., Winter 11/24/08

The Society will undergo a Change of Bank Account. The Bank of America account in California will be closed and a new account with the Bank of America in Virginia will be opened with the change of Treasurers on 2 October 2007. This will eliminate challenges experienced with the Bank of America in California. (In conjunction with the change of treasurers, Marcus conducted an audit and found Bob's books satisfactory. They were handed off to Lisa on 2 October.)

The meeting was adjourned at 12:35 PM by the President.

Addendum:

A committee discussion was conducted after the ADM on September 28, 2007 with Council Member Darrell Wallace of Rochester, Washington, on the software used for the MMD. Attending were Chair Wayne Jones; Past President and Director Marcus J. Wallace; and Directors James "Bowie" Wallace and Charles M. Wallace. In summary, Darrell stated that he thought Access and Excel were adequate for the Society's membership database purposes. He recommended using Access for the MMD, which is the software being used by the Membership Chairman. The Committee felt more comfortable about using Access and Excel for the Society's database after the discussion, and in having an effective and workable database for our MMD. Access will be the official copy of the MMD, and the Newsletter Editor will use an Excel copy for the generation of mailing labels and for selecting e-mail addresses for the distribution of the Newsletter. Details of the discussion are contained in a separate Committee Report.

BRAVING THE HEARTH: HOLIDAY DELIGHTS

"May your laugh, your love and your wine be plenty, thus your happiness will be nothing less."

Here are a few holiday recipes that you will love!

Holiday Egg Nog Punch

½ Gallon Egg Nog Ice Cream
½ Gallon prepared Egg Nog
1/3 Fifth Light Rum
1/3 Fifth Bourbon
1/3 Fifth Apple Jack Brandy
Nutmeg to garnish

Place egg nog ice cream into large punchbowl. Pour prepared egg nog, rum, bourbon, and brandy over mixture. Stir and refrigerate until ready to serve. Sprinkle with nutmeg before serving.

Deviled Ham Dip

1 cup Deviled Ham
1 cup Mayonnaise

1 cup Sour Cream
3 Tbsp. dried Dill Weed
3 tsp. dried Minced Onion
3 Tbsp. dried Parsley
3 tsp. Seasoning Salt

Combine all ingredients mixing thoroughly. Chill for at least 4 hours prior to serving. Serve in scooped out center of Hawaiian Bread loaf or with Vegetables.

Rocky Road Candy

1 cup Semi-Sweet Chocolate Chips
1 cup Butterscotch Chips
1/3 cup Peanut Butter
2 cups mini Marshmallows
1 cup salted Peanuts
½ cup Raisins

Mix chips and peanut butter in microwave safe bowl and cook on high for 2 minutes. Stir cook 1 minute more. Stir until smooth. Add remaining ingredients. Fill miniature cupcake pan lined with paper baking cups. Refrigerate until hard. Store in air tight container.
