MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD AT THE CROWN HOTEL KIPPEN 8TH OCTOBER 1998

- 1. PRESENT: N.Bielby, I.Condon, M.Everett, J.Reid, J.Shaw, C.Whaley.
- 2. APOLOGIES: R.Bond, R.Fuller, G.Naris, P.Sutherland.
- 3. MATTERS ARISING FROM HALF-YEARLY MEETING:
 - a) Revised Constitution: A revised Constitution had been drafted by the Hon.
 Secretary. It was agreed that it should be circulated before the Half-Yearly meeting in April for discussion at that meeting.
 - b) Use of Meiklewood by Stirling County and Revenue Received: The Treasurer reported that the sum of £120.00 had been received from Stirling County as payment for their use of Meiklewood during 1998. A number of their arranged fixtures had been rained off. Gargunnock had also made use of Williamfield on a number of occasions, and owed £60.00 to Stirling County.

 Mr. Scott had stated that he was willing to allow a maximum of six Stirling County games to be played at Meiklewood in any one season.
 - c) Sightscreens: The Treasurer reported that notice of a grant of £102.00 from Stirling Sports' Council had been received on August 11th.

 Work was to be completed by March 1999, and invoices to be submitted. The Treasurer went on to outline the proposed method of the construction of the sightscreens, which would be carried out by G. Naris.

- d) Annual Dinner: The Secretary reported that over twenty people would be attending the Annual Presentation Dinner, which would be held in the Crown Hotel, Kippen on Friday 16th October. Mr. Keith Graham, journalist, would be guest speaker.
- 4. TREASORER'S REPORT: C. Whaley distributed copies of the Accounts. The Club had a surplus of £792.41, although expenses' claims were still outstanding from some Club officials.
- 5. SECRETARY'S REPORT: N.Bielby gave a summary of an Extraordinary Meeting of the Strathclyde League that he had attended. Matters discussed had included teams calling off fixtures at a late stage. It had been agreed that any team calling off three of their fixtures for reasons other than weather would face expulsion from the League. M.Everett was to attend the inaugural meeting of the new Western District Cricket Union, which would organise and control all cricket in the west of Scotland. The Strathclyde League would be subsumed under the new organisation. The Secretary noted that although very few League games had actually been played due to bad weather and call-offs by other teams, Gargunnock had won promotion to Division 4 of the Strathclyde League. (There would be 6 divisions in 1999). Other teams in Division 4 were: Cumbernauld, Inverclyde, Ardrossan, East Renfrew and Kelbourne. Fixture dates were to be set by the Western District Committee.
- 6. TEAM SECRETARY'S REPORT: N.Bielby reported that the Club had 22 paid-up members, but it was felt that a few more were still needed. There was some discussion of trying to attract local juniors, but it was felt that boys would always gravitate to Stirling

County since the Club provided coaching and ran teams for different age-groups. It was, however, felt that an effort should be made to attract Gargunnock residents of all ages, perhaps through a poster in the village shop and a notice in the Stirling Observer.

PAVILION & PITCH MAINTENANCE: C. Whaley reported that Sunday 18th October had been designated for work on the square, weather permitting. G,Naris was to check the tractor which had been leaking oil. The repairs to the pavilion roof appeared to have been successful.

MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD AT THE CROWN INN, KIPPEN, ON 25TH OCTOBER 1999.

PRESENT: Mr. W.Scott (Chairman).

N.Bielby, D.Christie, I.Condon, M.Everett, R.Fuller, W.McFadzean, G.Naris,

J.Reid, P.Sutherland, C.Whaley.

APOLOGIES: J.Shaw.

1. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: These were unanimously approved.

 PROPOSED NEW LEASE: Mr. Scott stated that he was willing to grant the Club a new five-year lease commencing on March 15th, 2000.

This could be arranged by letter with R.Sandeman, solicitor. One of the previous trustees was known to have died, (T. Barber-Fleming). It was agreed that the new trustees should be the Club's elected Captain, Vice-Captain, Secretary and Treasurer. (Thus the trustees might change annually, with the office). It was agreed that the Club would pay the first £50.00 of the costs of drawing up the new lease. All present expressed their thanks to Mr. Scott on behalf of the Club for his generosity in extending the Club's lease on the existing very favourable terms.

TREASURER'S REPORT: C.Whaley reported that the Club's balance stood at £787.00.

In addition, £120.00 remained to be collected from Stirling

County,representing payment for four games played at Meiklewood. However, some expenses still remained to be paid. There was some discussion of the security of equipment. G.Naris had taken the mowers and scarifier home; Mr. Scott offered to house the tractor in one of his sheds.

4. SECRETARY'S REPORT: M.Everett suggested that he would try to arrange fixtures in the East of Scotland for the start of the season, as in recent years, Meiklewood had been unplayable for a number of weeks in April /early May. It was agreed after some discussion that the Club would continue to compete in the Village Cup, despite its £30.00 entry fee. It was also agreed that since we were likely to arrange fixtures against Doune at short notice when other matches were cancelled, and would also be playing them on Wednesday evenings at least twice, no Sunday fixtures would be arranged with them.

TEAM SECRETARY'S REPORT: N.Bielby reported that he selected teams from a base of 15 full fee-paying members. The fine scheme had been successful, and had raised the sum of £41.98. He suggested that the fines should also apply to Wednesday matches, and that there should also be a fine for being dropped when batting.

 GROUND AND PAVILION MAINTENANCE: G.Naris reported that the outfield had been cut for the last time in 1999, and the square

had been scarned. There was a problem of clover in the outfiled encroaching onto the square. He intended to kill the clover near the square using a hand-sprayer. Mr. Scott suggested that this should be done at once.

The pavilion needed to be painted, and it was suggested that members should meet on Sat. 30th October (afternoon) to do this job. The toilet shed had been painted, and the bannister-rail and skirting in front of the pavilion replaced. A patch in the floor of the visitors' dressing-room required repair, and sections of the back of the pavilion were "spongy". The condition of the roof was satisfactory, but the down-pipe needed to be regularly cleaned out.

The condition of all machinery was satisfactory. Mr. Scott enquired whether the Club could cut the entire field, (not just the outfield), but G.Naris replied that the grass was too long for the gang-mowers. He would enquire about the purchase of a rotary-cutter. He was also intending to extend the boundary on the far side.

R.Fuller suggested that the sight-screen was too small. C.Whaley suggested that if anothert screen was made, they could both be placed at one end. G.Naris stated that he would make another screen.

- 7. WET-WEATHER PROVISION: It was suggested that the existing two covers provided inadequate protection, and that a third was needed. G.Naris offered to construct a device to span the two presnt covers. Longer hoses were also needed to drain the water well away from the square. N.Bielby suggested a tarpaulin "tent" to cover the entire square, and M.Everett suggested the purchase of a sponge roller, but these proposals were rejected.
- 8. ANNUAL DINNER: G.Naris reported that the Terraces Hotel in Sirling was unavailable. However, the Gargunnock Inn could seat 26, and had been booked. The fines collecetd would provide the first drink free for everyone.
- 9. PLAYER AND CLUBMAN OF THE YEAR. ADDITIONAL AWARD: The Player of The Year calculated by N.Bielby's computer programme. G.Naris was also elected Clubman of the Year after a ballot of those at the Meeting. It was agreed that a further trophy would be purchased annually for presentation to the leading batsman or bowler. (Batsman if the Player of the Year was a bowler, and vice-versa). This trophy could be retained by the recipient. Qualification would be one-third of possible total of matches played; batting:highest average of those who scored over 100 runs. Bowling: lowest average of those who took ten wickets or more.

11. ANY OTHER BUSINESS: 1) Subscriptions: It was agreed that a Wednesday subscription of £10.00 would apply to those players who

did not pay a full subscription because they did not play at weekends. Full subscriptions would increase to £35.00. Juniors (under 18) and students would pay £15.00. Under 14s would pay £5.00. A proposal to increase match-fees for non-members was rejected. 2). It was agreed that G.Naris would be proposed by the Secretary for Stirling Council's "Service to Sport" Award.
