Having always entertained a lively interest in history and allied subjects, I have spent some of my spare moments during the past year in getting together such information as I was able to obtain of my father's family and its progenitors. This is not as complete as I would desire, but I intend at some time in the near future, unless prevented by some unforeseen difficulty or accident, to obtain additional data. It is especially my desire to trace back the history of the Cooper family to its first settlement in this country from Scotland or North Ireland.

With the names of the allied families presented in the title, I have only mentioned female members of the Cooper family who have become allied into other families by marriage. As an exception to this is the Rawlings family, my grandfather, Apollos Cooper, marrying Nancy Rawlings of Flemingsburg, Ky. Also as an exception is the Stanton family allied by marriage with Jasper Moss, my great aunt, Elizabeth Cooper, marrying Wm. Moss, his father.

An alphabetical order has been followed with the names of those allied by marriage, as given in the title.

In presenting this information I have followed an alphabetical instead of a chronological order for the members of each family and this order is maintained down to the last direct descendant of each person of each family. While this arrangement is not so historical, I think that it will be found much more convenient. In this manner each one of my great grand father, Jacob Reed Cooper's children is given alphabetically, with the descendants of each child down to the present. This arrangement is facilitated by reference numbers, as will be observed in the text. I trust that it will serve the purpose sufficiently well.

Finally I wish to thank those, who by filling out the blanks, have enabled me to compile this article. The family history begins with my great great grandfather, Apollos Cooper, who lived in Loudon county, Virginia, in the Potomac valley, previous to the Revolution.

Apollos Cooper served as a second lieutenant and as a lieutenant in Captain Charles West's company, known also as Reuben

Briscoe's company, Third Virginia Regiment, commanded by Colonel Thomas Marshall, Revolutionary war. Commissioned second lieutenant February 9, 1776; promoted lieutenant (presumably first lieutenant) August 7, 1776, and was killed September 11, 1776 or 1777.

I am indebted to Mr. Moss for the following information concerning Frederick P. Stanton:

"Born at Alexandria, Va., December 22, 1814. Died June 4, 1894 at Ocala, Florida. He was a member of Congress from the Memphis, Tenn., district five terms and was chairman of the Judiciary Committee of the House of Representatives. He was by President Buchanan appointed Secretary of the Territory of Kansas. Afterwards as acting governor in 1856, he obtained great fame as a fair and honorable man of great resolution and nerve, when under threats of assassination on refusal, and against the dictates of the President of the United States and his cabinet, he refused to issue certificates of election to pro-slavery men because of fraud at the polls, and called the legislature in extra session to set aside the fraudulent adoption of the Leecompton Constitution that forced slavery on the Territory of Kansas. For these acts he was deposed by the President. It was the bitterness engendered in this struggle, continued in prolonged and intensified by time that afterwards, in 1861, resulted in the war of the rebellion. Notwithstanding, Stanton had been a life long Democrat, he came within one vote of election to the U. S. Senate on the admission of Kansas into the Union of the States in 1861.
