## Chapter 3 of Kerr Roots and Shoots



19th Century Coach and Coachman

James Kerr (1808-1891) and Barbara (Henderson) Kerr had three children between 1831 and 1836 in Mid Calder, and a further nine between 1837 and 1855 at Meadowbank Lodge, Kirknewton, on Lord Meadowbank's Estate.

Their oldest son, James, *named after his paternal grandfather*, is born in Mid Calder on the nineteenth of August, 1832. Subsequently he is traced as lodger in a hostel in Leith in the 1871 Census, and his occupation given as an unmarried Mason's Labourer. However by 1881, and still single, he has become a coachman, and is lodging with a Holdane family at 3 High Riggs, Edinburgh ..... v.i.z.

By the 1890s, still single, and still a coachman, he is living in the Edinburgh City Poors House, Craiglockhart, Colinton and as can be seen from the following registration document, he dies there of Apoplexy on September the Fifth, 1894..

Barbara and James' next child was Robert, my Great Great Grandfather, born in Mid Calder on the Fifth of November, 1833 *and named after his maternal grandfather, Robert Henderson.* As he is my direct line ancestor, I will skip his story meantime and deal with it last in the account of this particular generation.

Suffice to say, he also became a Coachman!

Completing the births before removal of the Kerr family from Mid Calder to Kirknewton in 1837, is Margaret who, on the twenty-fifth of October was christened with her maternal grandmother, Margaret Pollock's name. All that can be said about Margaret's life is that it was short. She died aged about age twelve of unknown cause in 1849. By this stage, duty had been done (*and with subsequent deaths, would continue to be done*) to the forenames of the four grandparents, James **Kerr**, Margaret Roberts,

Margaret Pollock and Robert **Henderson**. Thus the way was open to parents James and Barbara to name any other future offspring in honour of their employer's family forenames, and then indeed Barbara herself.
