but these include marriage contracts and deeds of settlement. A great deal therefore still remains to be done even in this register and the remaining records in the Court House at Inveraray. But the present Volume indicates what these and similar registers contain, and it may be said that no Argyleshire family of Campbell is unrepresented, and that not a few hitherto unknown and unattached members of the Clan are for the first time brought to notice here. It only remains to acknowledge that thanks are due to Baron Lüttwitz, who claims descent from Colin Campbell, Bailie of Tiree, and who shared the cost of the examination of this register, and to Mr. B. M. Wright, Sheriff Clerk Depute at Inveraray, for his courtesy and kindness to the Editor and his son during their several visits thither for the purpose of making these Abstracts. The Index is also the work of Mr. Henry Paton, junior.

INTRODUCTION.

THIS Volume is the first of a series which it is intended to publish from the large collection of Campbell information gathered from public and private record sources by Sir Duncan Campbell of Barcaldine and Glenure, Baronet, for the purpose of providing materials for the construction of accurate and reliable memoirs of the various branches of the Clan Campbell. Until such materials are provided, it is an impossible task to write such histories, but the effort to supply these is a heavy strain both on the time and the resources of a single man. A great deal has been done, but as much and more still remains to be overtaken, and would soon be accomplished if the like enthusiasm and interest were shared by other representatives of the great and widely ramified Campbell Clan.

As the cradle of the Clan, Argyllshire may justly be expected to yield from its record treasuries the most copious and interesting information, and hence a beginning has been made with the Sheriff Court Books at Inveraray. By these are meant only that portion of the records in the custody of the Sheriff Clerk there known as the Probative Register of Deeds, besides which there are judicial and other records and innumerable unarranged papers. Moreover, it is only a portion of this Register of Deeds that has been dealt with and noted in the following pages. It commences in 1689, and continues through nearly thirty goodly volumes to the close of last century. These volumes are full of deeds of various kinds relating to Campbells, and the first eight, to 1724, have been with regard to this name fully exhausted, except that mere cases of the protesting of bills were disregarded. From Volumes 8 to 18 inclusive only a selection of the more important deeds were made.

Campbell, late of Duntroon, in favour of Donald McCallum, bailie of Glasrie, of a sum of money; also to Archibald McCallum, his eldest lawful son, and his heirs of law, etc., of his lands of Bargirgag in the parish of Ariskeodnish; dated at Stockowillen 10th June 1798; witnesses, Alexander Campbell of Kilmartin, Donald Campbell of Oib and Alexander Campbell of Kirnan.

1781, September 21st.—Contract of Marriage, dated at Ballichwan-sale 24th March 1749, between Mr. William Campbell, minister at Kilchrenan and Dalvaich, on the one part, and Miss Jean Stewart, youngest lawful daughter of the deceased Mr. James Stewart of Clunzie, minister at Kililian (?),

with consent of Mr. James Stewart of Clunzie, minister at Kilbrandan and Kilchattan, her brother german, on the other part, containing a provision and a tocher of £100 sterling each; witnesses, Colin Campbell of Carwhen and John Stewart, brother german of the said Mr. James Stewart.

1781, November 7th.—Bond by Smollet Campbell, Lieutenant in the 71st regiment of foot, to Duncan Campbell, writer in Inveraray, for £400 sterling, with Assignation in security thereof of a Bond of Provision by the deceased James Campbell of Craignish of £400 in favour of the said Smollet Campbell, his son, dated 3rd April 1762; dated at London 3rd February 1781; witnesses, Major James Campbell of the West Fencible regiment, and Captain Alexander Campbell of the 74th regiment.

1783, January 6th.—Contract of Marriage, dated at Auchnacrevie 17th December 1759, between Nicol McNicol, elder, portioner

of Elerigmore, on the one part, and Mary Campbell, widow of Alexander M'Calman, tacksman of Auchnacrieve, on the other part, containing a life rent annuity to her of £40 sterling; witnesses, Mr. William Campbell, minister of Kilchrenan and Dallavich, and Donald Campbell of Bragleenbeg.

1783, July 8th.—Contract of Marriage, dated at Carsaig 7th May 1757, between James Campbell at Beachmore, on the one part, and Isobel Campbell, eldest lawful daughter of Daniel Campbell of Carsaig, on the other part, containing 500 merks of provision for her annuity. One witness is Duncan Campbell of Kilduskland.

1783, November 8th.—Contract of Marriage, dated at Edinburgh 8th December 1760, between Walter Paterson of Poldreat in Haddingtonshire and Mrs. Agnes Campbell, daughter of the deceased Angus Campbell of Asknish, containing £20 annuity to her. No tocher is mentioned.

1740, May 27th.—Contract of Marriage, dated at Lochgare and Campbeltoun 4th and 16th January, between John M'Neill of Portneill, in the County of Antrim, Ireland, and Mrs. Margaret M'Neil, now his spouse, with consent of Hector M'Neill of Taynish, her brother german. There has been no Contract for their marriage. (Vol. 12.)

1746, August 8th.—Contract of Marriage between Archibald M'Neill, uncle to Donald M'Neill of Colonsay, on the one part, and Elizabeth M'Neill, lawful daughter of the deceased Neill M'Neill of Arichonnan, with consent of Archibald M'Neill, now of Arichonnan, her cousin german, and others, dated at Killoran in Colonsay, etc., 11th June 1736. Angus M'Neill, brother german to Donald M'Neill of Colonsay, is one of the witnesses. (Vol. 13.)

1755, December 17th.—Contract of Marriage, dated at Pennymore 15th May 1742, between Duncan Fisher, writer in Inveraray, and Margaret M'Neill, lawful daughter of the deceased Malcolm M'Neill of Colonsay, containing an annuity of £50 sterling. Mention is made of Donald M'Neill of Colonsay, her brother german. James Fisher, present provost of Inveraray, is a witness. (Vol. 15.)

1784, April 20th.—Postnuptial Contract of Marriage between Donald M'Ilvernock, younger of Ardnachaig, with consent of John M'Ilvernock of Ardnachaig, his father, on the one part, and Elizabeth M'Neill, daughter to the deceased Donald M'Neill, brother german to Ardreglaine, and now spouse to the said Donald M'Ilvernock, with consent of Elizabeth Campbell, her mother, on the other part, for providing an annuity to her; dated at Ardnachaig 1st June 1756. (Vol. 18.)

1784, April 20th.—Bond of Provision by Donald Graham, younger of Ardnachaig, in favour of Elizabeth M'Neill, his spouse, of

an annuity of £7, 8s., sterling, in consideration of her renunciation of her liferent right to the Bond granted by Duncan M'Ilvernock of Oib, and John M'Ilvernock, younger thereof, to him and his said spouse, and their children to be procreated. This is additional to that provided by their Contract of Marriage, dated 1st and 8th June 1756. This is dated at Barnashallog 23rd February 1761, and witnessed by Donald Graham, tacksman of Barnashallog. (Vol. 18.)
