Dr. Cramer is known for her engaging teaching style, fostering critical thinking and inquiry among her students. She currently serves as Chair of the Board of Directors for the Kentucky Humanities Council and as Senior Associate Editor of the journal American Speech.

This Month in Scottish History

In May 1707, the Act of Union between Scotland and England went into effect. Scottish church bells played the tune "Why am I so Sad on my Wedding Day?" The union was brought about in spite of opposition by the majority of Scots. James Ogilvy, 1st Earl of Seafield, as well as Member of Parliament for Banffshire and Lord Chancellor of Scotland promoted the Act of Union of 1707, but then moved to repeal the Act in 1713.
