In this episode, our host Jackie Bird talks to Dr. Callum Watson, Battle Coordinator at the Battle of Bannockburn visitor center, about one of Robert the Bruce's boldest gambles. Before the massed ranks of the English and Scotlish armies on 23 June 1314, Bruce risked his life, his throne and Scotland's independence in a moment of deadly single combat. We relive the Bruce v de Bohun and the fight which helped define the greatest King of Scots.

June's Program: a Live Zoom Presentation. University of Kentucky-Dr. Jennifer Cramer. Bio: Dr. Jennifer Cramer is a Professor of Linguistics at the University of Kentucky, where she brings her passion for language and communication citation to the classroom. She holds a Ph.D. In Linguistics from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and her research interests span a wide range of topics, including sociolinguistics and discourse analysis, with a particular focus on language variation and change in Appalachia, the American South, and Kentucky. Dr. Cramer is known for her engaging teaching style, fostering critical thinking and inquiry among her students. She currently serves as Chair of the Board of Directors for the Kentucky Humanities Council and as Senior Associate Editor of the journal American Speech. Title: "Understanding the Roots of Appalachian Englishes," which discusses the impact of Scotch-Irish heritage on the Englishness spoken in Appalachia today.

ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP DUES – UPDATES and NEWS!!

There are some new and exciting changes regarding how the membership is managed and tracked. In the past everything has been done manually, with spreadsheets. As you can imagine, this gets very cumbersome. Also, when the leadership changes for the Membership Commissioner role, it can difficult to pick up where the other person left off. For the last few months, a team has been working on additions and changes to our web site. Specifically for membership.



Ongoing, when you go to the "Become a Member" link it will look a bit different. Most of you have been using this yearly to renew your memberships. Now when you click on the link, it will bring up the membership levels for you to choose from. Once you click on that, there are boxes for you to create a login username and password. Also populate your name, address, phone and Clan affiliation. Then you will click on the Paypal button as usual. What is different? Well, you will now be in the database of our web site, along with all your information. Also, your membership will **AUTO RENEW every year**, one year from your payment date in the web site. If at any time you want to cancel, you would do that via your "subscriptions" in your Paypal. This will make it so much easier to keep track of your membership, and make sure that everyone is on the mailing lists.

Please make note of your username and password. You will need them at some point in the future, as there will be a members login button, along with members only information on the web site. Work in progress to add value to your membership.

If you joined between Jan. 1, 2025 and now, your renewal will be due in 2026. You will need to follow the instructions above by April 1, 2026.

I know that some of you will want to continue to pay by check. But we do encourage you to use this new system, as the old method is very cumbersome and time consuming. If you pay by check your dues will continue to be due on April 1st each year.
