FREDERICA FILM PREMIER

The new film for *Fort Frederica National Monument*, with a working title of *History Uncovered*, is tentatively scheduled for its premier on Saturday, February 12, 2005, during the Frederica Festival. Current plans are to preview it the preceding Friday night, February 11, for the reenactors who participated in the filming.

The film was shot on location at Fort Frederica, Fort King George and Williamsburg. It was produced by *Great Divide Pictures*, under the direction of **Sonny Hutchison** and **Chris Wheeler**. *Clan An Cu* portrayed the *Highland Independent Company of Darien* during filming at Fort King George on August 27-29, 2004.

BATTLE OF CULLODEN & SAVANNAH GAMES WON'T CONFLICT
