
IN-PERSON MEETINGS - COMING 2022

To all who have been waiting patiently for our organization to gather again - we are happy to announce that we will be resuming in-person meetings will start again in 2022. The board has made some requirements and set regulations we will expect moving forward until we believe it will be safe to resume as normal.

- The board will need to see proof of your vaccination card when you come to the meetings (this can be the physical card or a photo of the card).
 We will be checking for them at the door before you enter. Signs advising this will be at the door before you are checked in.
- All members, guests and/or any attendee must wear a mask during the entire meeting (unless you are eating or drinking).

and the Battle
of North Inch Resolution of a
Dispute
Between Clan
MacPherson
and Clan

Davidson in 1396

In September 1396, 30 representatives of the Clan Chattan and 30 from the Clan Kay fought in an attempt to settle a feud. This was one of the last judicial combats, or trials by combat, to be fought in Scotland. To discuss this further - in our last monthly meeting - our SSI historian Carson Smith presented "Clan Chattan and the Battle of North Inch - Resolution of a Dispute Between Clan MacPherson and Clan Davidson in 1396".

Here are some highlights from that presentation. The Battle of North Inch was the last judicial dispute in Scotland. Origin of "Chattan" is the following - tribe of Gauls, servant of St. Cattan (the first Irish missionary). Chattan was its own separate clan with its own chieftain then combined their clan with McPherson and McIntosh. There are several clan mottoes and tartans that are associated with the Clan Chattan. The chosen symbol on the clan badge is a wildcat - reason this animal was chosen is that it is the only cat that survived in the UK. Many discussions were made as to the battles in who would be where with leading or powerful clans during this time. 10 years of fighting and disputes would take place between the McPherson clan and the Davidson clan - there were even battles to the death. One known individual during this time/battle was Henry the Smith. He killed

many members of Clan Davidson to the point where only a handful were left. The actual name "Smith" is derived from armorer or smith like a blacksmith. The "Smith" name is associated with Clan McPherson and is a very common surname in Scotland. To this day, Clan Chattan has one of the most famous discussions that dealt with Clan McPherson and Clan Davidson.

The Board would like to thank Carson Smith for a wonderful and informative presentation. We always learn a lot from Scottish history and this one is no exception.
