HOLIDAY FUN / THINGS ABOUT SCOTLAND



November Meeting Recap -Meeting the 1st SSI McMath Scholarship Recipient / Who Were the Picts &



What Happened to Them

During the beginning of this meeting, we got to meet the first recipient of the SSI McMath Scholarship. His name is Reese Chesher. He is currently a junior at IUPUI - studying with a major in history focused on 18th century European history. He advised he is wanting to concentrate more on the Scottish enlightenment and various thinkers during that time period (epidemiology). Chester stated he has been to the Scottish Festival & Games in 2019 and he is hoping to go back again in the future. He stated he is blessed to have received this scholarship as it is helping with his tuition, college journey at this time during the pandemic.

Then, we had our SSI member Armand Hayes talk and give a presentation on the Picts. The Picts were first seen in 300 BC and then they disappeared down the road. Pictographs were the main source of communication for this group of people. To this day, it is hard to find traces or even

lineage with the females of this group of people. It is easier with the men. During the early medieval times, sources report the existence of a distinct Pictish language - it was said to be believed to have been a Celtic language, closely spoken by the Britons (as the Pictish language as since been extinct. The Picts were assumed to have been the descendants of the Caledonians and other Iron Age tribes. Here is an interesting fact: St. Ninian's Isle Treasure contains the best collection of Pictish forms. Other pieces of information were given during this presentation. The board would like to thank Armand Haves a wonderful presentation on this subject. This presentation was interesting and learned some great things about these people.
