


# \*\*MEMBERSHIP REVIEW\*\*

MAY '21 MEETING REVIEW: VOICE OF THE ISLES ~ BRIEF HISTORY OF THE BAGPIPES



The meeting this month is about the musical instrument of the bagpipes. SSI member and Celtic Rain performer Jeffrey Kestin talked about the "voice of the isles" - which is the nickname for the bagpipes. The instrument became virtually synonymous with the Celtic nations, mainly Scotland. The bagpipes are mentioned in the Bible - mostly in Daniel 3:15. There are a number of theories on how the bagpipes were shown in history and different countries like Egypt and ancient Persia. It was said to be the instrument of the Shepherds of the Middle East. In fact. the emperor Nero was reputed to be an avid piper during ancient Rome. Within ancient Rome, Julius Caesar brought the bagpipes within the military culture. It has been said that Scotland was not the first Celtic nation to take up the instrument - it was more Ireland that had this music played first. The expanse of British empire saved the bagpipes - the instrument is known on the battlefields of highland regiments. With the PowerPoint playing for the meeting, Kestin did perform and give a demonstration of the instrument itself with a song and a couple of chants. The information and music brought great elements in learning about the bagpipes.

The board of trustees would like to thank Jeffrey Kestin for his time and presentation this month. This was a great insight to the musical instrument and how it really was a part of ancient/modern history.
