

1) St. Andrew was not Scottish. He was born in Bethsaida in Galilee,

which is now Israel.

- 2) He was Jesus' first disciple. He was one of 12 disciples, along with his brother Simon Peter.
- 3) St. Andrew is not just the patron saint of Scotland. He is the patron saint in other countries including Greece and Russia. Also, he is the patron saint of the Order of the Thistle, one of the highest ranks of chivalry in the world.
- 4) He was crucified on an X-shaped cross. Legend says that he asked to be tied to an Xshaped cross because he did not feel worth of dying on the same shape of cross as Jesus. The shape has been represented by the white cross on the Scottish flag, the Saltire.
- 5) People took pilgrimages to the site of some of his remains. One of the remaining relics of this saint is stored in St. Mary's Cathedral in Edinburgh.
