### PATRICK LESLIE, OF THE DARLING DOWNS

On the night of the 6<sup>th</sup> Oct 2000, the headstone of Patrick Leslie and his wife Catherine Macarthur was vandalised along with twenty other headstones and crosses, at the West Street Rest Park at North Sydney. It was the worst case of vandalism that the North Sydney Council has experienced in a decade.

You would wonder at the mentality of such people, who are so bored that they have nothing better to do.

North Sydney Council has received a quote from monumental masons, "Gottelli Restoration" of Blakehurst Sydney, for an inclusive cost of \$23,941.50 to repair all the damage caused. It is not known at this stage, whether the repairs will be covered by Councils insurance, or whether it will have to pay for the repairs with funds from the Capital Works program.

Where has society failed, that such acts of vandalism occur with no thought at all to the history of the people who are commemorated?.

#### [2] FROM NEW ZEALAND

Henry Leslie was born in 1812 at St Peters Place, England and married Charlotte Richardson at the Parish Church of St Peter's in Canterbury England on the 13<sup>th</sup> April 1842.

They decided to emigrate to New Zealand and left Gravesend on the 28<sup>th</sup> September 1850 with their two children, Ann Elizabeth [5] and Henry Junior [2], on board the Castle Eden.

On the voyage out to New Zealand, Henry Leslie caught a chill at Capetown and died the morning of arrival in Lyttleton Harbour on the 14<sup>th</sup> of February 1851. The following morning, Charlotte Leslie came ashore with her two young children, followed by another boat containing the coffin of her late husband, Henry.

Exactly 150 years later the descendants of Henry and Charlotte held a reunion to celebrate the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of their arrival at Lyttleton.

About 80 descendants of Henry and Charlotte gathered at Kirwee, near Christchurch NZ on the 17<sup>th</sup> February 2001. A message of goodwill was received from the Earl of Rothes and read to the gathering and a cake was cut by the only living descendant of the third generation, Eric Eaves, aged 93, who had married Hilda Leslie.

An oak tree was planted by the eldest and youngest Leslie's present, Brian Henry Leslie and Jack Wilson Leslie.

A plaque bearing the words was attached to a cairn in front of the oak tree.

'This tree was planted 17 Feb 2001, to commemorate the arrival of the Leslie family in Lyttleton 150 years ago, and who settled in this area".

A short church service was held by the Rev Ray Leslie, a lolly scramble for the children, many photographs taken and a good old chin wag completed the day.

A standard certificate is \$17-00 and not subject to GST for Births, Deaths and Marriages.

There are privacy restrictions on the supply of certificates.

**Births:-** The registered person, parent, spouse, brother, sister, child or grandchild. Other, ring for information.

**Marriages:-** Bride, Bridegroom, child or grandchild of the marriage. Other, ring for information.

**Deaths:-** All death records are available to anybody.

**Internet:-** You can apply for certificates through the internet by going to:-www.maxi.com.au

You can also apply through the various Registries in NSW, QLD, TAS, SA, WA, NT and the ACT

## SCOTTISH CUSTOMS FOR NAMING CHILDREN

The Scots had a very highly developed system for naming their children. This involved using the paternal and maternal grandparents Christian names.

The eldest son, after the paternal grandfather.

The second son, after the maternal grandfather.

The third son, after the father.

The eldest daughter, after the paternal grandmother.

The second daughter, after the maternal grandmother.

The third daughter, after the mother.

Any further children would be named after earlier ancestors, using both christian and family names, using the same patterns, but generally the naming patterns were less structured.

This structure helps where the names of parents and grandparents are not known, and can help to piece together which generation belongs where.

#### SCOTS ORIGINS [4]

Members are advised that Scots Origins, a database of Scottish genealogy information, has now launched a database of English Genealogy information in cooperation with the Society of Genealogists in England. This is a pay by use database. similar to Scots Origins.

Access costs Six pounds for 48 hours use. Within this time, users can view and download 150 records. Hard copies will cost Ten pounds. You can take advantage of the free surname search to determine whether there are any records of use, before committing themselves to the £6 search fee

#### A FEATHER IN YOUR CAP

is often misunderstood why the Scottish custom of wearing a feather in the cap arose. It was quite simply a very convenient way of distinguishing the Clan Chief and his Chieftains in battle.



The Royal family is entitled to wear four feathers in the cap.

The Chief of a Clan is entitled to wear three feathers in the cap.

Chieftains of a cadet branch or Laird are entitled to wear two feathers, if they have their own crest.

A gentleman with his own crest may wear **one** feather in his cap.
