

I am pleased to announce that Clan Leslie Society of Australia and New Zealand, now has a Patron and a Chaplain. Our Patron is The Right Reverend Kenneth Leslie, O.B.E. B.A. Th.Schol, Sixth Bishop of Bathurst.

The Rev Kenneth Leslie is well known to country people from NSW, as in May 1971 he walked from Dubbo to Bathurst to raise funds for the completion of the Anglican Cathedral at Bathurst. He received well wishes from Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and the Prime Minister of Australia, William MacMahon and the NSW Premier of the day, The Hon RW Askin. He was also a Rector at Darwin when the city was bombed by the Japanese on 19 February 1942. In future editions of Grip Fast Down Under, I shall give you further information on the Rev Kenneth Leslie, the Bishop who walked. His life is documented in the book, "The Bishop Who Walked" by his son Simon Leslie. I have a copy of the book and it makes fascinating reading and if anyone would like to purchase a copy, I can give you the address.

PRIVATE ALBERT VICTOR LESLIE

Private Albert Victor Leslie Private 5609 27th Bn Australian Infantry A.I.F. was the son of W and Emily Leslie of Clare South Australia and was born at Jamestown South Australia and was the grandson of John and Ann Leslie who were married in Ireland and arrived in Australia in 1852. He enlisted in the A.I.F. 16 May 1916, aged 24 years and five months.

He embarked on the "Anchises" in Adelaide 28 August 1916 and arrived in Plymouth 11 October 1916. The 27th Battalion sailed for France 13 Dec 1916. After continued service he was given leave in England on 12 Jan 1918 and returned to France 28 Jan 1918.



He was killed in action in France 2 Sept 1918 just two months before the Armistice and was

laid to rest in Peronne Communal Cemetery, St Radegonde France.

His grave is III E 39 Peronne Communal Cemetery Extensions Somme France. To find the cemetery you take the N17 from Bapaume. On entering Peronne, turn right towards the hospital and once you reach the hospital, take the small road opposite and the communal cemetery is at the end of this road. The extension is on the south-west side of the cemetery.

TARTAN DAY 2002

It seems to be an appropriate time to mention that whereas Tartan Day is celebrated in North America on the 6th of April, it is celebrated in Australia and New Zealand on the 1st July.

The significance of the 6th April is that the Declaration of Arbroath was signed at The Abbey of Arbroath requesting that the Pope recognize that Scotland was a Sovereign nation and was

independent of England and very significantly it stated that the Scottish King was King of the Scots, not King of Scotland.

The importance of the 1st July, is that it is the date that the Act of Proscription of 1747 was repealed. This act made it a treasonable offence, amongst other things, to wear tartan or play the bagpipe. Many people believe that the recognition of the 1st July as Tartan Day has much greater significance than the 6th of February, but does it really matter, why not wear the tartan on both days?

As a matter of interest, Sir Andrew Leslie, VI Dominus Ejusdem, ancestor of many of the Leslie's alive today was one of the great Barons of Scotland who signed and attached his seal to the Declaration of Arbroath on the 6th April 1320.



UNVEILING OF KATE LESLIE SCULPTURE AT LESLIE DAM

On the 21 October 2001 a sculpture of Kate Leslie [Macarthur] was officially unveiled at Leslie Dam, which is 13 km out of Warwick, Queensland on the Cunningham Highway to Inglewood. The site of the town of Warwick was selected by Patrick Leslie, he also purchased the first block of land sold in the town.

Among the persons attending the unveiling, were Philip Leslie of West Pymble, GG Grandson of Patrick and Kate, his sister Diana Cowland-Cooper, and descendants of Kate Macarthur's family, Robert and Margo Macarthur.

Warwick Mayor, Ron Bellingham and the Member for Maranoa, Bruce Scott unveiled the sculpture, which was funded by the Federal Government Community Projects Fund.

BLUFF OYSTERS "BAKED"

Following my recipe for Whitebait Fritters, which several members advised that they had tried and found very enjoyable, I now give a recipe for Bluff Oysters Baked, although I would expect that Australian members will have to make do with Pacific oysters, which are larger than Sydney rock oysters.

The ingredients are as follows for six people.

- 2 dozen oysters
- 3 tablespoons of cooking oil [olive or vegetable]
- Salt. [a good pinch, freshly ground rock is best]
- Black Pepper [freshly ground to suit]
- Lemons [juice from 1 or 2 to suit]
- White Breadcrumbs [1 cup]
- Butter [30 grams or 1 ounce]
- Mustard Powder [½ to 1 teaspoon to suit]
- Curry Powder [optional. ½ teaspoon]

Time:- 20 minutes

Temp:- 180° to 200° C / 400° to 450° F

Make sure that the oysters are well drained. Mix lemon juice, oil and seasonings as a marinade in a shallow dish and put in oysters. Leave for approx 30 minutes. Melt butter in a small frying pan and

stir in breadcrumbs and cook until lightly coloured. Remove oysters from marinade and drain well on paper towel. Roll each oyster in the cooked breadcrumbs and place separately on a baking tray. Bake in a hot oven for about 20 minutes or until puffed and crisp. Serve with salad or chips.
