

SHANE LESLIE'S GHOST BOOK

John Randolph Leslie was a son of Sir John Leslie, 2nd Baronet, and his wife, Leonie Jerome. He was raised at Glaslough Castle in County Monaghan, Ireland and attended Eaon College and King's College, Cambridge. He was the author of several books including *The End of a Chapter* published in 1916. He converted to Roman Catholicism, changed his first name to "Shane" and supported Irish independence. He also became a believer in ghosts, and believed that Catholics had a right to investigate the ghostly as part of the universe. He collected every possible type of ghost story in an effort to classify them.

Shane Leslie's Ghost Book was first published in 1955 and was published by Hollis & Carter, London. It is a small book, only 160 pages, and consists of two parts: Part One being "On Ghosts and Poltergeists" and Part Two which is twenty-seven "Catholic Ghost-Stories." The stories range widely, from early saints to well-documented hauntings of our own days.

It is an easy book to read, and is interesting if you like ghost stories. He tells the stories well.

I would have them by July 10th, in lots of time to go to Edinburgh. I was very thankful to Margaret and grateful for their fantastic service.
