

THE CHAPEL OF THE GARIOCH

The Clan Leslie has chosen the Chapel of the Garioch as the place to install the Leslie's Cross which will honour the Leslies who died at the Battle of Harlaw in 1411. The red granite Cross will be put in a prominent place, the grassy area in the front of the Chapel, and dedicated at a special ceremony on July 24, 2011.

The Chapel has had a long association with the Leslie family and other significant historical families. The Chapel of the Garioch was originally a private Chapel in the Parish of Logie-Durno which had its church at Old Logie. This Church was in existence in 1151 and until 1583 was a parish Church.

When Christian Bruce, sister of King Robert, married one of his strongest supporters, the King gave her as a dowry the Lordship of the Garioch. Around 1350 Christian founded and endowed the Chapel of our Lady of the

Garioch on the heights of Drumdurno so that masses might be said for the souls of the Founder, her brother and her husband. So began the Chapel of the Garioch.

On January 22, 1420, as a result of another feud with the Forbes, Sir Andrew Leslie who had retreated to his fort at the top of Bennachie came down and did battle with his opponents including the Sheriff of Angus. Sir Andrew was killed at Braco, about two miles from Bennachie. His wife, Isabel Mortimer had tried to stop the fighting but was unsuccessful. Isabel Mortimer bequeathed an annual amount for a priest to pray for his soul for all time. The Ogilvies of Granden and Forfar also granted an annuity for a Chaplain to perform divine services for the soul of Sir Andrew Leslie, Knight, in the Chapel of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

In 1473, King James III granted a charter which provided an annual stipend for the support of a Chaplain at the Chapel of St. Mary of Garioch to pray for the souls of Alexander Leslie, the second son of Sir Andrew and his wife Isabella.

By 1500, through endowments gifted by the Mar and Leslie families, five other priests were attached to this small but Royal Chapel. Mary Queen of Scots, during her stay at Balquhain Castle in September 1562, heard mass in the Chapel, a fitting close to its 200 years of aristocratic history.

In 1583 it became the Church of the Parish of Logie-Durno. In 1599 the Presbytery decreed that the small Parish of Fetternear, long vacant, should be united with Logie-Durno and a new Church built for the joint Parish at the site of the Chapel of the Garioch. The walls of the old Chapel disappeared, but it gave its name to the new Church, called simply 'The Chapel', and through the Church to the new Parish. For a long time it was known as 'The Parish of Logie-Durno, commonly called the Chapel of the Garioch' until common usage won the day.

In 1620, after the Reformation, the Chapel was converted into a Parish Church and given the name of The Chapel of The Garioch.

The present Church, the same length as the old but almost twice as wide, was opened for worship in 1813. The form was the usual rectangle with narrow sides east and west; four pointed windows in the south wall with the pulpit between the two centre lights and round three sides a gallery entered from an external stair. In its latter days the walls were elaborately stenciled in various colours while the ceiling, painted blue, was spangled with gold stars.

In 1922 it was extensively renovated by the Congregation. The back gallery was removed and a Chancel with a window of five lights was built out from the north wall. In 1931 the Women's Guild donated stained glass for the window and while the Church was being redecorated in spring 1959 a Memorial Mosaic Plaque was inserted in the Chancel wall, this Chapel is an extremely interesting example of what can be done with the usual heritors' building of 1750-1850 and today it is one of the most beautiful of Scotland's country Churches.

Afterwards, Leslies and their friends will gather at an historic Leslie House for dinner, to renew their friendships, meet new cousins and toast the ancestors who fought for this beautiful homeland. The following week, those attending will tour many of the famous Leslie Castles, Bennachie and other historical places. The recreation of the Battle of Harlaw, the play "Red Harlaw" and special displays at museums are also planed for that week.

Some donors have asked what we would do if we collected more funds than we need for the Leslie's Cross. The Planning Committee has offered the following list with the items placed in order of priority:

- 1. Print the Order of Service Booklet with all the names of donors, names of dignitaries attending the service and some Harlaw history. Copies of this booklet would be mailed to everyone who donates to the fund.
- 2. Add a carving on the Leslie's Cross of the Arms of Sir Andrew Leslie.
- 3. Create a time capsule to be installed in the memorial stone.
- 4. The Clans who were at Harlaw are seeking approval to replace the Clan Cairns which were placed on the Harlaw Battlefield. A Leslie Cairn could be placed on the Battlefield in participation with the group of Clans. Would you not like to participate in this historical Leslie project? The donations are at approximately 70% of the needed funds. See the top of page 6 for the information about how you can donate to the Leslie's Cross.

HARLAW REMEMBRANCE PLAN

- 1. A Leslie history of Harlaw. Copies of *The Griffin* have been mailed to all CLSI members. The lead story is by David Leslie from Leslie by Insch, "The Leslies and the Battle of Harlaw." David's story of Harlaw pulls together the whole story of the cause of the war with Donald of the Isles and the Leslie involvement prior to and during the Battle of Harlaw.
- 2. **The new Leslie's Cross.** Monument companies have been asked to quote on a red granite cross to be installed in the Churchyard of the Chapel of the Garioch. The plan is to depict the Leslie's Cross which was placed on the battlefield in 1411 and has long since disappeared. It will be inscribed with a memorial to the six sons of Sir Andrew Leslie and the other Leslies who fell defending their homes and the City of Aberdeen.
- 3. **The Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire Councils.** Several events will take place beginning Sunday, July 24, 2011, with the laying of a wreath by the Provost at the Harlaw Monument and continuing through that week. Plans are for a play of the Battle of Harlaw, a re-creation of the Battle and battlefield camp, and other historical displays at art galleries and museums.
- 4. Order of Service Booklet which will Include the Names of Participants and Donors. You could be a part of Leslie history by participating in the Leslie ceremony to remember the Leslies of Harlaw or by contributing to the cost of the monument. If funds permit, a booklet listing the names and hometowns of all the contributors will be produced and mailed to each donor. A copy will be preserved in the permanent Clan Leslie Library Collection.
- 5. **A Clan Leslie Gathering.** There will be a Leslie Gathering involving Clan Leslie members from all over the world. The Clan Leslie Gathering in 1995 was such an event and attracted Clan Leslie members from many countries. The 1995 hosts, David and Leslie Leslie introduced many of us to the great history of the Clan and to many historical Leslie sites in Aberdeenshire. This time we have the possibility of attracting even more Scottish Leslies because of the major historical significance of the Battle of Harlaw. The Leslies of Warthill have generously agreed to arrange our Gathering Dinner at their Warthill House.
- 6. **Stay at a Leslie Castle.** The working group needs to know who plans to be there. Sebastian and Candida Leslie from Warthill House have been very generous in making rooms available at Warthill House and Lickleyhead Castle, two Leslie homes. A Clan Leslie Dinner, for Sunday July 24, 2011, has been planned at Warthill House. If coming from afar, plan to arrive by Saturday July 23, 2011.
- 7. **Tour Historical Leslie Sites.** We would like to arrange transportation and joint attendance at events and visit historical Leslie locations. All Leslies, Abernathys, Bartholomews, Carneys, Laings and Moores are welcome to participate. You do not have to be a member of the Clan Leslie Society. It takes time to plan such an event so if you are interested in being at this historical event in remembrance of the Leslies of Harlaw, please send a message to:

I use the term "Call to Arms" because this project is, in a sense, a call to battle. It is for a battle against ignorance and a battle against apathy. It is a matter of education. When people do not have good examples or role models, or if they just do not get to know about them, then it becomes harder to have a common background or language to share visions and to do good deeds. The Leslies and the 2000 other members of the army under the Earl of Mar, successfully battled against the 10,000 men under Donald of Islay, Lord of the Isles, in order to protect their families and homes. It has been said that: "Only those who are willing to die for freedom deserve Freedom." President Kennedy also said and I paraphrase: "Ask not for what your country can do for you; but what you can do for your country." Today's world is just too lacking in the above qualities. We are drowning in apathy. This project will do its part in educating the world about the supreme sacrifice made by the six sons of Sir Andrew Leslie of Balquhain, Baron of Balquhain, and other Leslies, and the other 500 who died that day at Harlaw to protect their homes and families. This is why I salute you and all the others who participate here in this project as their *personal* "Battle against ignorance; and Battle against Apathy."

The above paragraph is not only what I believe in, but it may also assist you in your application for 501(c)(3) under "education" status. "Education" is more than just running schools or giving scholarships. Publicizing information or building monuments that can serve as examples or role models, to teach people about history and the *meaning behind* historical events, should also qualify as "education". President Kennedy's above quote is not an empty quote. The 500 men who made the supreme sacrifice at Harlaw actually lived that spirit.

AFTER THE FIRE, LESLIE HOUSE IN FIFE





Leslie House has been much talked about in the last couple of years mostly due to the very large fire that destroyed the entire inside of the building. To keep you all up to date with what it looks like today and let you know what should be happening with in the future, I took a trip to see for myself and took some photos. The

interior of the building has all been gutted except for a couple of lower rooms. The rooms that the fire missed or at least the firemen saved have all been damaged by a partial collapse of the ceilings and plaster on the walls.

The staircases and all of the interior structure of the rooms is gone. The roof does not exist and some stonework is badly cracked. Some of the stone roof decoration has been taken down and will eventually be put back when rebuilding starts. Most of the interior is still black from soot.



The recession we are in at the moment has halted any work but the builders have time to get all the new layout plans drawn up and approved by the building control and Heritage Scotland. We can hope that this all gets back on track as soon as the financial problems the banks caused get sorted out. A couple



of the photos I took were of the timbers removed during the stripping out of the building after the fire; they show how most of the major

timber beams were attached to each other by wooden pegs. Other photos show the stonework removed and still black with soot. I was surprised to find the flag pole still attached. The vandals have been at the fountain at the rear of the house and broken the lower support for the bowl. The good news is the gardener has been hard at work and has re-laid the garden at the side of the house with grass and some plants. The orangey has been opened up to show the timbers are well rotted but it will be replaced with a similar replica in due course. Let us hope it starts soon.

IN MEMORIAM ARTHUR ROBERT "BOB" LESLIE III

Arthur Robert "Bob" Leslie III, 65, of Millville died on Wednesday, July 28, 2010, at the South Jersey Healthcare Hospice Care in Bridgeton, after a brief illness .Born in Millville, Dec. 12, 1944; Bob was raised in Millville and was a lifelong resident, graduating from Millville High School in 1963. Bob was a letter carrier for the Millville post office for 11 years, and then became a licensed optician, working for Dr. Rodis, as well as several other local optometrists. During World War II, Bob's father, Private Arthur Robert Leslie Jr., served with the 116th Infantry Regiment of the famed 29th Infantry Division, landing on Omaha Beach on D-Day. Unfortunately, Bob never had the opportunity to meet his father, because he was killed in action near St. Lo, France, during the Battle for Normandy, on July 17, 1944, five months before Bob was born. When Bob was a young man, he learned of his father's fate, thereafter keeping his father's memory close at heart and was always very proud of his dad's service to his country. After the war, the American Legion selected Private Art Leslie to represent Millville's deceased veterans of World War II, combining with Malvern J. Nabb, representing deceased veterans of World War I. The Millville post was now known as American Legion Nabb-Leslie Post No. 82. Bob served in the National Guard, was a member of the Sons of the American Legion, and also played in the post's band. Bob enjoyed cooking and listening to music. He also was well regarded as a DJ.

BOOK - THE ANTECEDENTS OF THE ABERNETHY FAMILY IN SCOTLAND, VIRGINIA AND ALABAMA

Apparently it has been difficult for Abernethys to trace their heritage further than the "elusive" Robert Abernethy, who arrived in Virginia in 1632. The answers lie in a book titled The Antecedents of the Abernethy Family in Scotland, Virginia and Alabama by Thomas Perkins Abernethy. Part of the answer is that this Robert Abernethy had been a Scottish soldier in the Battle of Dunbar in 1650 or Worcester in 1651. General David Leslie commanded the Scots at Dunbar. The Battle of Dunbar was a disaster for the Scots. The Scottish soldiers captured by the English were divided "into three classes: the common soldiers were to be paroled and permitted to return to their homes; non-commissioned officers and officers below the rank of captain were to be transported to the colonies; Highlanders, captains and field [grade] officers, as well as the landed gentry were to be sent to the Tower" in London.

Robert Abernethy was "transported" to Virginia, where he was "sold" by the English as an indentured servant to serve for five years to pay for the cost of his "transportation."

Abernethys who are interested in this Robert Abernethy and his descendants, can purchase this book from Books of My Ancestors, 2025 Dunsmore Lane, Waxhaw, North Carolina 28173. Books of My Ancestors appears to be a subsidiary of AbeBooks. You can order online by doing a Google search on Books of My Ancestors. Cost of this paperback book is about \$10.88

BOOKS - JACOBITES OF 1715 NORTH EAST SCOTLAND & JACOBITES OF 1745 NORTH EAST SCOTLAND

A book by Francis McDonnell, *Jacobites of 1715 North East Scotland* and *Jacobites of 1745 North East Scotland* lists Scots who were known supporters of the House of Stuart, and specifically in 1745 Prince Charles Edward Stuart. Originally printed in St. Andrews, Scotland in 1996. Reprinted as two books in one for the Clearfield Company by the Genealogical Publishing Company, Baltimore, Maryland 1997, 1998, 2000.

In the uprising of 1715, the following were identified as Jacobites.

Abernethy, John, of Mayen: Eldest son of Alexander Abernethy, 1st. of Mayen, and his wife, Isobel Hacket, daughters, Jean and Elizabeth, and son, James. Having shot John Leith of Leathhall in Aberdeen in 1763, he was outlawed and fled to France where he was visited by Lord Fife in 1766.

Leslie, Charles "Mussel-Mou'd Charlie" 1715 & 1745: So called from a singular projection of his under-lip. He was born in 1667, a natural son of Leslie of Pitcaple. A ballad monger, described as a thin man, about 5 feet 10 inches in height, with small fiery eyes, a long chin and red hair. Died at Old Rayne in 1782 at the extraordinary age of 105 - probably the last survivor of the Rising of 1715.

Leslie, The Rev Charles of Glasslough: The family of Leslie of Glasslough, Ireland is descended from the Wardes branch of the family of Leslie of Balquhain. Born 17 July 1650 sixth son of Rev Charles Leslie, admitted to Trinity College, Dublin in 1664. He married Jane Leslie and had two sons, Robert and Henry.

Leslie, James, of the Warthill family: Eldest son of Alexander Leslie, Minister of Crail in Fife, and his wife Helen, daughter of John Seymour, Minister of Macgill. Married Catherine Mills, and died in 1730, having had three sons and three daughters.

Leslie, John, Baillie, Aberdeen: Probably died about 18 September, 1730.

Leslie, The Rev. William, of Little Folla: Eldest son of George Leslie, 4th Laird of Little Folla and his wife Isabella. Sometimes schoolmaster at Auchterless, he went to Ireland to assist his uncle in Fermanagh, He retired to Little Folla and died in 1722, aged 71.

Jacobites of 1745 North East Scotland. The author notes that "Not all supporters [of the House of Stuart] were voluntary, many being forced out by their feudal superiors. Many more claimed to have been forced out in an attempt to regain their freedom from imprisonment after [the Battle of] Culloden."

Abernethie, George: Merchant and Magistrate, Banff. Captain. Prisoner at Carlisle.

Abernethie, John: Tanner, Strathbogie. Hired out by inhabitants, who were forced by John Gordon of Avochie. Lurking after Culloden.

Abernethie, John: Overseer of the Highways. Tyrie, Aberdeenshire

Abernethy, Alexander: A farmer in Tipperty, Banff. Also described as a surgeon, with wife and four young children. Taken prisoner at Carlisle, he was condemned to hang, was reprieved for a time, during which he fell sick and died.

Abernethy, George: A merchant and Magistrate at Banff, assumed to be brother of James Abernethy of Mayen. Described as cheerful, good-natured and agreeable, he was about 45 years at the time, and a very reluctant rebel. Married to Elizabeth Forbes, daughter of John Forbes of Boyndlie. He died of consumption on 27 April 1747, and was buried in the churchyard of St. Margaret's, Westminster. [NOTE: There may be some confusion with the George Abernethie listed above, also a "Merchant and Magistrate, Banff"].

Leslie, Alexander: Farmer, Auchinhanich, Banffshire. Ensign. Lurking after Culloden

Leslie, James: Labouring servant, Old Meldrum.

Leslie, John, 7th Laird of Warthill.

Leslie, William: A farmer's son, Hillhead of Turriff. Lurking after Culloden.

More, John: Auchmore, Midmar. More, John, jun: Auchmore, Midmar, More, Peter: Knockando, Banffshire
