

Flower of the Forest

Winifred "Wini" Groover McDuffie

Wini gently passed away on October 8, 2021. Born in Atlanta on March 4, 1927 to Marshall Eugene Groover and Mary Winifred Power Groover, Wini grew up in La Grange, Georgia and attended LaGrange College before graduating from the University of Georgia and Emory School of Nursing. She married Bruce McDuffie, our past President, in September 1950. The couple lived in Atlanta and in Washington, Pennsylvania before settling in Binghamton, New York in 1958. Wini lovingly raised their three children, nurturing and encouraging their creativity. Music was always playing and crayons and paper available for drawing! Wini obtained a Masters degree in Early Childhood



Education from SUNY Binghamton and pursued additional graduate work in **Intergenerational Studies at Cornell** University. She worked at the Interracial Association in Binghamton, taught preschool, community college, and continually advocated for young children and families. Wini and Bruce moved to Chattanooga, Tennessee in the late 1980s where she worked as Volunteer Coordinator at Senior Neighbors; she later volunteered at Calvin Donaldson Elementary and community after school programs, and delighted in teaching art to children. Wini's generous heart and caring nature are celebrated by everyone fortunate enough to have known her. Bruce accused her of running "Soft-touch

Manor" where homeless cats and dogs always found welcome. Her genuine warmth, concern, and love for all creatures is her enduring legacy, and she lived her life with amazing grace. Wini is survived by her brother Charles Groover (Jacqui) of Gainesville, GA, three children: Susan McDuffie (Salvador Romero), John McDuffie, and Judie Churchill (John), three grandsons: Robert Churchill (Meghan), Sean Churchill (Adrianna), and Zachary Churchill, four great-grandchildren and numerous much-loved nieces, nephews, and cousins. Wini leaves us with many wonderful memories.

MacDuffee Clan Society Scottish Calendar

November 30, 2021 St. Andrew's Day

St. Andrew has been the patron saint of Scotland since the 9th century. However, it wasn't until 2007 that St. Andrew's Day became an official bank holiday in Scotland. Many of the traditions that are associated with St. Andrew's Day go all the way back to pagan practices. Some of these pagan practices, which include Saturnalia and Celtic practices, were intermingled with Christian traditions. In Scotland it is often celebrated with traditional Scottish food and dancing. It is also often seen as the beginning of the Scottish winter festival seasons which begins with St. Andrew's Day and concludes with Hogmanay and Burns Night.

January 25, 2022 Robert Burns Night

January hails a dinner celebration for all Scots-the birthday of Scotland's most famous poet, Robert Buns. Traditional elements of the Burns Supper are held all over the country featuring the famed national meal called Haggis. It is an obligatory dish during Burn's Night for it was so loved by Burns that he devoted a poem to the dish. It is served with neeps and tatties (turnips and potatoes).

The tradition of Burns suppers started soon after the poet's death in 1796 by several friends and about 200 years later became a nationwide holiday.

Burns suppers include a piper greeting the guests, a predinner recitation of The Selkirk Grace, a prayer written by Burns, and followed by the Immortal Memory Toast so everyone may honor the poet. Often there are very Scottish silent auctions (whisky), great fun and an evening ending, with Burns, by singing his Auld Lang Syne.

April 6, 2022 National Tartan Day

National Tartan Day, observed in the United States on April 6 every year, commemorates the day that the Declaration of Arbroath (or the Scottish Declaration of Independence) was signed in 1320. The reason it's so important is that the American Declaration of Independence was actually modeled on the Declaration of Arbroath and quite a big proportion of the Founding Fathers were of Scottish descent as almost half of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, and nine of the 13 governors of the newly established United States, were Scottish.

Returning in person for the first time since 2019, the NYC Tartan Day Parade will take place on Saturday, April 9, 2022, in historic midtown Manhattan. The swirl of kilts, the skirl of bagpipes and the cheers of thousands of spectators await. This beloved celebration of Scottish-American culture promises to be extraordinary in scope, talent and turnout as we gather in person once again.

May 27, 2022 International Macfie Clan Day

July 7-10, 2022 Grandfather Mountain Highland Games and our Annual General Meeting on July 9th. For over 60 years Grandfather has been our Home Games.

September 16-18, 2022 New Hampshire Highland Games & Festival at Loon Mountain

BOOK REVIEW

"The Colonsay & Oronsay Pilgrim Trail"

In the Footsteps of the Earliest Christian Missionaries to Scotland By Kevin Byrne and Andrew McMorrine Available through House of Lochar, Isle of Colonsay, Argyll, Scotland PA61 7YR

This well-researched, little book is the perfect companion for those who are interested in not only the Christian history of the Isles of Colonsay and Oronsay, but those who wish to explore the isles by foot, auto or cycle. The trails will give the traveler a new perspective on the isles and their beauty and history. The book is divided into six sections that can be followed at leisure in any order, and up to one/third of these trails can be driven or cycled. It is amazing how much history has been woven throughout the book and there is no doubt that traveling these trails will give you a new appreciation of these beautiful isles...exploring areas and monuments that had not previously been seen or noticed. The reader will find many monuments, cairns and rock formations. This was researched using open sources and paid subscriptions.

She died suddenly on-board SS Warimoo in Wellington Harbour on 4 January 1906 in her 63rd year. Ye know not on what day your Lord cometh. hitherto had been 'passed by' without knowing the historical significance of their "stories in stone." You will find new meaning in the remnants of stone that tell a story of when Christianity first came to the isle. The book contains several references to "MacDuffie" within the Oronsay Priory and, most significantly, elaborating on the Oronsay Cross of Malcolm MacDuffie, our Clan's last Chief. You will find this reference, as well as others in Section 2 of the book.

This book is excellent for not only for the religious historian, but the recreational hiker as well. *Oronsay: The book uses this spelling of the isle in accordance with the Ordinance Survey, although local usage prefers "Oransay" in reference to its Gaelic name, "Orasaigh." (Editor's Note: We met Kevin on our first visit to Colonsay in 2006. At that time, he was the Harbor Master as well as the driver of the school bus. He unselfishly provided us with his time, as well as a litany of information on the Macfies/MacDuffees on Colonsay. Kevin is the Isle Historian, and publisher of several newsletters on various aspects of Colonsay life, flora and fauna, as well as being the proprietor of several self-catering cottages on the isle. He is an encyclopedia of knowledge on the history and genealogy of the isle.

Duties of the Student Board Member include the following:

- 1.) Responsible for sharing of Scottish information, assisting with coordination of the Clan Society Marches at the AGM at Grandfather Mountain Highland Games, and providing a Society interface with children in the MacDuffee Clan Society.
- 2.) Participates in the review of Clan Society Scholarship recommendations unless they are a candidate.
- 3.) Assures that Clan Tents are maintained.
- 4.) Student Board members do not have a vote in Clan Society affairs unless they are at least 18 years of age prior to the AGM.
- 5.) Student Board Members are to be at least 13 years of age by the first AGM in which they serve and may serve for 2-year terms unless reelected unopposed.
- 6.) Encourages other youth members of the Society to compete in the Highland Games competition.
- 7.) Attendance at AGMs is not mandatory, but input is important.
