Scottish Heraldry

Since we have no photos or Games stories to share for 2020, I thought it might be an opportune time to introduce Scottish Heraldry and then continue Heraldry Articles in further issues of the Clan Chatter. First, the good news. Revd. Dr. Joseph J. Morrow CBE, QC, LLD, The Right Honourable Lord Lyon King of Arms in Scotland, has granted posthumous Arms to my (our) ancestor, John McDuffee (1690-1752) and matriculated those Arms, with congruent differences, to me and my heirs. I now have Arms and other descendants of John McDuffee (1690-1752) may also make petition.

After a number of years of working on family genealogy I still was not sure how an individual would complete the challenging task of petitioning for a Coat of Arms from the Lord Lyon of Scotland. As a matter of chance, I met Dr. Bruce Durie while attending the Laurinburg Scottish Highland Games three years ago. Dr. Durie, an expert on Scottish Heraldry and Genealogy, provided the professional guidance which, coupled with a great deal of research, got us off to a great start.

The process of petitioning for Arms has introduced me to the language of Heraldry and the necessary documents required to meet the standards of the Court of the Lord Lyon. I am still learning.

So, I have asked Dr. Durie to write a summary (see below) of the actions taken in order to provide our members, especially those that descend from John McDuffee (1690-1752) of New Hampshire, who may have interest in securing their own Arms a look at what the process involves. First, you must know that Heraldry is Scots Law. For reference Dr. Durie's website is www.brucedurie.co.uk.

Dr Durie's Article: Thomas Patrick McDuffee has Arms!

"Yes, Tom McDuffee is now an Armiger in Scotland, all done, dusted and legal courtesy of the Lord Lyon, King of Arms.

It took about a year from soup to nuts, and cost about the same as a small second-hand car or a short family holiday. But it is heritable, and will racket on down the generations for all time.

How did we accomplish this?

It started from a conversation in a tent at a Games and Gathering in America some time ago, when Tom said something like: "Of course, I can't get Arms, because I'm not Scottish (living in Scotland)", and I said "But a McDuffee ancestor was, and if we can prove that, and every generational step in between, we possibly could. We start with your genealogy".

To cut a very long an involved story as short as possible, this required getting original documents, or certified legal copies/extracts from various County, State and National authorities in the USA, all the way back some eight or nine generations to one Daniel McDUFFEE (1738- ca. 1807), the fifth son and youngest child of eight of John McDUFFEE, who likely emigrated from Ulster to New Hampshire ca. 1718-1721, and most likely as part of the Aghadowey migration of 1718-19 along with Revd. John McGregor and others.

Before that, these McDuffees likely came furth (as we say) of the Isles of Colonsay and Oronsay, and the famous M(a)cDUFFEEs or M(a)cFIEs from these isles (both of these names arising from the Gaelic *Mac Duibhshíthe* ("son of *Duibhshíth*"), and nothing to do with M(a)cDuff, a surname from the Kingdom of Fife on the other side of Scotland.

Now, it would have been wonderful – and it is often possible – to trace an American in the straight surname line by to an original emigrant/immigrant Scot....Fabulous. But here we had to exercise another option – an ancestor living in America prior to September 3, 1783.

Why that date? Because that's when the treaty of Paris was signed by representatives of King George III of Great Britain and of the United States, including Benjamin Franklin and John Adams, accepting that the USA was a free, independent and sovereign country. Before then, America was part of Britain (or at least, Britain behaved as if it believed that!) and therefore the Lord Lyon in Edinburgh could have found heraldic jurisdiction over anyone of Scots origin or descent living in America.

Bingo! We have Daniel McDUFFEE (1738- ca. 1807) and for good measure, his father John (McFEE) McDUFFEE (whose Will was dated 29 July 1752). So, let's ask the current Lord Lyon to do what his distinguished predecessor Lyon would have done, and grant Arms – albeit posthumously, to John McDuffee (ca. 1690-1752).


But which Arms?

By convention – and indeed by law (because Heraldry is fully part of the Statute Law in Scotland, not just some ancient custom-and-practice exercise) – Everyone of the same surname must have Arms which are recognizably similar, but obviously different. Therefore – AND PLEASE READ THIS CAREFULLY, POSSIBLY TWICE:

- There is no such thing as a "Family Coat of Arms" in Scotland, nor is there any such thing as an "Armigerous Clan or Family" both of these are utter non-historical fictions dreamed up in modern times by people who want to sell you things;
- Arms belong personally, legally and heritably to one person at a time;
- It is not justified to find Arms on some website bearing your surname and adopt them as your own they are someone's property, even if that person is dead or not otherwise using them;
- And anyway, how do you know you have the correct Arms, as different people in different branched of that surname will have different Arms.

There is no evidence that the Oronsay or Colonsay MacFee/McDuffee folks used Arms, but we do have two ancient examples:

- A MacFie of Langhouse re-matriculated older Arms in 1864, as shown below.
- A Macfie of Dreghorn matriculated Arms in 1867. Other, more modern, MacFie Arms are also shown.



Tom McDuffee was granted the following Arms

The claymore and birlinn (galley), is a constant and identifying feature of MacFie/McDuffee Arms. Given the very likely Oronsay/Colonsay connection, and the existence of the famous Colinus MacDuffie Oronsay Cross, the Lord Lyon was persuaded that John McDuffee (ca. 1690-1752) should get these Arms:

Parted per fess wavy Azure and Or, in chief the Oronsay Cross Proper surmounted of a claymore Argent, point downward, in base a single-sailed birlinn Proper in full sail facing sinister, all within a bordure Argent.

The bordure Argent (white border) indicates that John McDuffee is an "indeterminate cadet" of the original Oronsay/Colonsay line.

If Tom McDuffee had been the direct heir of John McDuffee, he would have borne these Arms. As it happens, Tom is the 1st son of a 5th son of a 2nd son of a 1st son of a 2nd son of a 3rd son of a 5th son of a 1st or 2nd son – which determines the design of his "cadet" version.

Parted per fess embattled Azure and Or, in chief the Oronsay Cross Proper surmounted of a claymore Argent, point downward, in base a single-sailed birlinn Proper in full sail facing sinister, all within a bordure Argent bearing three flowers of the tulip tree Or.

The embattled line of division indicates generations of military service.

The three *flowers of the tulip* three recent generations of the



tree (Liriodendron tulipifera) are for the family in the Great State of Indiana.

Is there also a crest?

Tom McDuffee asked for,



and was granted, a crest and motto.


A griffin armed and beaked Argent langued Gules holding between its paws a claymore Proper.

The griffin is a reference to Purdue University, alma mater of Tom McDuffee and many members of his family. In medieval heraldry, the griffin became a Christian symbol of divine power and a guardian of the devout. The claymore is obvious.

Motto

There are various MacFie/McDuffee mottos down the years. Tom chose a variant of one of "Complete the Task".

Pennon



He additionally requested a pennon, which was granted:

Pennon 120 centimetres in length or thereby of two tracts of the Liveries and with the Arms of the Petitioner in the hoist bearing his Motto counterchanged Azure and Or, the said Pennon being limited to the Petitioner and his heirs successors in he said Armorial Bearings.

Can any other M(a)cfie/M(a)cDuffee get Arms?

Possibly. And each of them would start at one of the same places:

- Do you have an ancestor who was granted Arms in Scotland?
- If not, can you PROVE an ancestor who came from Scotland?
- If not, can you find an ancestor who lived in America before 1783?
- Or better still can you prove a connection to one of the ancestors in Tom McDuffee's line? Because if so, half your job is done.

Can Dr Bruce Durie help?

Dr Durie has Right of Audience at the Court of the Lord Lyon. He is also considered internationally to be one of Scotland's foremost genealogists, and can help with those researches (which, often) must come first.

He can advise on, petition for and shepherd through the sometimes confusing and involved processes in getting legal Arms in Scotland, and in other heraldic jurisdictions."

In *Beckers History of Waterloo* for the year 1900 there are two cigar manufactures listed. John J. Carroll made the Bloomer brand of cigars. The other one was Betz & Lozier, which sometime around WWI was bought by LeRoy McDuffie as he is listed in *Beckers History* with John Carroll as a cigar manufacturer in 1921.

L. A. McDuffie had a cigar factory (or store) located on N. Seneca St, Waterloo, NY. He was the son of Knox McDuffie, and Knox was the son of Joseph. LeRoy was married to Mary E. (Hurd) McDuffie. L.A. stands for Leroy. LeRoy had a daughter that married Oswald Kidd and they had a son who married a Kumkey girl also from Waterloo. LeRoy (1871-1944) died in his forties and his business died with him. Julie currently has two of L.A. McDuffee's cigar boxes that are in very good condition.



History of the Celtic Cross



The Celtic Cross has been a symbol of both culture and faith for more than 1,500 years and probably far longer than that. The true origins of the Celtic Cross are unknown but there are many theories.

It may have begun as a pagan symbol but it was championed by Christianity in the form of the High Crosses around Ireland and in illuminated manuscripts. The majority of people who use the Celtic cross symbol now are Christian but many people also wear Celtic cross pendants as a symbol of their Irish (or Scottish or Welsh) heritage.

MacDuffee the Younger Scholarship

Following is a summary of our scholarship that is available for eligible students. Application cut off is May 1, 2021. The MacDuffee Clan Society supports education and knowledge of our Scottish & family heritage. Winners will be announced at the Annual meeting in July each year.

Purpose: The MacDuffee Scholarship recognizes college bound high school seniors

based on citizenship, contributions to Scottish Heritage, academics and

service to the MacDuffee Clan Society.

Criteria:

The students eligible for consideration must be graduating high school seniors who have been accepted at either a two- or four-year college or university. Consideration will be given to accomplishments and activities such as: academics, community service, activities in their church and school, awareness of Scottish Heritage, knowledge of their family genealogy, and admission to a College or University. Successful applicants will be asked to write a half page paper regarding their family history. All eligible students will be the children, grandchildren, step children or adopted children of active MacDuffee Clan Society members in good standing.

Guidelines: Scholarships will be awarded and disbursed each year at the Annual General meeting in July. All eligible candidates are to submit their Scholarship Application by May 1st of their senior year in High School.

Amount:

Scholarships may range from \$250 to \$500 at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee. One scholarship may be granted each year. The scholarship is for one year and is not renewable.

Deadline: The deadline for submission of a Scholarship Application is May 1st of each year. The post mark or media date on the submission will be strictly monitored.

Scholarship Committee: (5 Members)

The committee will consist of the President, Vice President and Treasurer, Secretary, editor of the Clan Chatter and one member at large appointed by the President based on recommendations of the Executive Committee.
