

UNIVERSITY OF GUELPH LECTURES WERE FASCINATING AND ENLIGHTENING

Following the AGM, Clan MacRae headed to nearby University of Guelph which houses the Centre for Scottish Studies. This is the oldest and leading academic unit in North America that carries out research and teaching on Scottish history and culture with an emphasis on the Scottish Canadian community.



By way of introduction, we were given an overview of the Scottish Studies archives and special collections on a wide range of topics, including agriculture, business, religion, clan information, emigration and chapbooks (pamphlets with short stories, poems and ballads). This was followed by a very entertaining talk by Professor Kevin James on the dynamics of Scottish migration to Canada. He highlighted the Scots deep-rooted culture of mobility and outlined the factors that describe distinct phases of emigration from the late 1700's to current times. The significant contribution of Scottish people to the development of Canada was underlined.

Finally, we benefited from a talk by Professor Elizabeth Ewan about charters—medieval land deed documents that can reveal much about the life and genealogy of early Scottish settlers. That is, if you can read Latin! We gained a real appreciation for historians' sleuthing abilities in deciphering and learning from these ancient records. A few examples of land charters were on display for us to view.

On a beautiful sunny, crisp November 11th day in White Rock, B.C., we remembered those who fought and died for Canada. We also remember those who fought, came home and left their memories with us. This year was especially memorable as it was the 100th Anniversary of Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae's passing. I was honoured to stand alongside our President of the Clan MacRae, Owen MacRae and fellow Clan member, Dave McRae while Owen laid the Clan MacRae wreath.

Even though 100 years have passed, you would be hard pressed to find a Canadian who had not heard of John

McCrae's famous war memorial poem "In Flanders Fields." I know as a young girl in elementary school we had to memorize this

poem and recite it to the class. Now and then when I am reminded of John McCrae I still manage to repeat his poem to myself, while picturing those white crosses and thinking of the young men who lay beneath them. So many of them who left us far too soon with dreams they never fulfilled.

On November 11th I always think how fortunate I am to be here. I had two grandfathers who fought in WW1, and both managed to return home. My Great Grandfather Alexander McRae along with five of his six sons, Robert, William, John, Archibald and Alex, signed up for WW1. The family had only arrived in Canada between 1908 & 1910. By 1914 some were already off to war. Below is a little trib-

ute to Alexander and his five sons who returned home safely.

Alexander McRae (Father)- born July 7, 1858, and lied about his age to follow his son's into war. He joined the army on January 25, 1916, at the age of 58. He was with the 121st Overseas Battalion "Western Irish" when he developed pneumonia, and somehow they realized his real age. He was discharged March 15, 1918, at the age of 60. Robert McRae (Son)- joined the Army on November 9, 1914, and by April 29, 1916, he was reported missing in action. On June 8, 1916, he was officially reported as being a prisoner of war at Giessen, Germany. When he was discharged in March of 1919, he received \$480 for the time he had spent as a POW. On Roberts return to Canada he went into the logging industry, and within five years he had died after falling off a log boom. William McRae (Son)- signed up in New Westminster with the 47th Battalion on November 7, 1915, and arrived in England on November 22, 1915. I was told his rate of pay was \$18 - \$20 per month while in the army. He was later discharged on June 19, 1919.

John McRae (Son & my Grandfather)- signed up with the 47th Battalion on June 13, 1915, and embarked for France on August 10, 1916. While in Le Havre, France he was granted ten days leave to return to his birthplace of Elgin, Scotland to marry Christina Moir, my Grandmother. John returned to France and ended up at Vimy Ridge. John was very reluctant

to talk about his experiences in war and there was only once that I know of that he shared with his eldest Grandson, Bruce McRae about the morning they took the Ridge. John returned to Canada on August 14, 1919, and went to work with Lucky Lager Breweries.

Archibald McRae (Son)- enlisted on April 3rd, 1916 with the 121st Battalion, same Battalion as his father and served in the front lines of Vimy Ridge. Archibald was receiving \$31 per month and was discharged on April 28, 1919. Alex McRae (Son)- joined the Army on November 9, 1914, and serves as a private in the 29th Battalion (Tobin's Tiger's). Alex was a piper and was transferred from the pipe band in 1915 to become a bomb thrower. He was also a stretcher bearer on the front lines in France. On November 16, 1917 while in Passchendaele, France, his unit was being shelled and four members of the band, who were working as stretcher bearers, were killed with a single shell. Alex was only 20 to 30 feet away from his pipe band comrades. Alex being a piper gave me some of his music sheets, and amongst it, I found a handwritten poem I would like to share with you. I have tried to find out who may have written this poem, as it refers to a different war than Alex was in. Maybe someone out there may know!

PROPOSED STATUE IN CALGARY OF LT. COL. DR. JOHN MCCRAE, AUTHOR OF "IN FLANDERS FIELDS"

- 1. The lead Non-Profit Organization is to be resolved soon.
- 2. Parks Foundation Calgary is the Project Gift Administrator and probably the construction manager.

- 3. The structure of the fundraising process through Parks Foundation Calgary is described in their website and the FAQ below. There is a need for a \$2500 deposit to start the funding process. This initial \$2500 will not be tax deductible, but all subsequent major donations made through Parks Foundation will be tax-deductible.
- 4. I would be responsible for fundraising, and would be the nominated Project Leader. No spending would proceed until all funds are raised and no organizer, including myself, will make any money from the John McCrae statue project.
- 5. The sculptor would be Ruth Abernathy, subject to availability, who did the two Ontario sculptures of John McRae. The Calgary sculpture will not be identical to the Ontario versions, and will be a new design.

Ruth received an Honorary Doctor of Laws degree from Wilfrid Laurier University on October 30th.


- 7. The Calgary Foundation has been approached and while no formal commitment has been made at this early stage for funding, has expressed verbal support for this endeavour.


