Cousin Spotlight on Bob Utley's Family

Robert Lynn "Bob" Utley was the fourth child and second son of John Prentyce and Annie Bernard Utley. Bob was born on September 18, 1941 in Jackson, Madison County, TN. Bob's only child is his son, Robert Jason Utley. Our Cousin Spotlight is focused on Bob Utley, son of Bob Utley, grandson of Prentyce and Bernard Utley, and great grandson of John Allen and Lilla Maude Utley.

[In response to a questionnaire, Bob Utley wrote:]

My full name is **Robert Jason Utley.** I was born Sept. 2, 1970 at 5:29 p.m. in Methodist Hospital,
Memphis, TN. I was told that my mother went to the doctor for checkup and was immediately admitted. I arrived soon after.

One of my first childhood memories is falling in the swimming pool and my dad jumped in fully clothed to rescue me.

I remember this about celebrating Christmas: The anticipation the night before and seeing the smiles as family members opened gifts.

Early school memory: We moved from Memphis to Shreveport, LA, when I was 3 and I started Montessori School and loved it.

The family vacation I remember best: Disney World. I was fascinated by the Magic Kingdom.

My first paying job: I had my own lawn service during the summer starting at 10 years of age.

My longest employment as an adult: I have been in the mortgage industry, both retail and wholesale, for the past 7 years.

I attended University of Florida 1988-1993, received a Liberal Arts degree. My favorite subject in school was Criminal Justice, and my least favorite was anything to do with math.

Elmer Massey 1926—2007

Our deepest sympathies are extended to **Sarah Utley Massey** and her entire family. **Sarah's** husband, **Elmer**, passed away on August 1, 2007.

This obituary was printed in the *Commercial Appeal* [Memphis, TN] on August 2, 2007.

"Senatobia - **Elmer Massey** died August 1, 2007 at Baptist Memorial Hospital, Memphis. Visitation will be at First United Methodist Church in Senatobia at the Fellowship Hall on Saturday, August 4 at 10 a.m., followed by services at 12 p.m., with burial in Bethesda Cemetery.

Born in Whitehaven, TN on April 20, 1926, he attended Whitehaven High School. He later moved to Raleigh, TN, and graduated from Nicholas Blackwell High School in Bartlett, TN, in the class of 1944.

After graduation, he married **Sarah Utley Massey** in 1947. They moved to DeSoto County in January of 1949. There he owned and operated Plum Point Dairy Farm with his father.

He served as president of DeSoto County Farm Bureau, and he served on the Mississippi Farm Bureau Board of Directors. He was a member and officer of the American Milk Producers Association, served on the Horn Lake School Board, and was a member of the Horn Lake Methodist Church. In 1973, they moved to Senatobia, MS, where he owned and managed Lyndale Farms.

Mr. Massey served as president of the Tate County Farm Bureau for many years, and was a member of the Tate-Panola Drainage Board. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church.

Mr. Massey was preceded in death by his parents, William Joseph Massey and Addie Bell Droke Massey; his brothers, William Shands Massey and Joseph **Pendleton Massey**; and his son, **Steven** Henry Massey. He is survived by his wife of 60 years, Sarah Utley Massey; sister, Mrs. James Edwards (Irene); son, Michael Joseph Massey and wife, Terri Robinson Massey; daughter, Lynn Massey Grenfell and husband, James Byrnes Grenfell. He was a loving grandfather to Brandi Lane Massey, Elizabeth Massey Parker and husband, Eric Parker, Michael Joseph Massey, Jr., Sarah Elizabeth Grenfell, Catherine Byrnes Grenfell, Madeline Leigh Massey, John Gaines Massey, and John Thomas Parker, great-grandson."
