GARGUNNOCK VILLAGE CRICKET CLUB. MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

HELD AT THE CROWN HOTEL, KIPPEN 25.10.2000

PRESENT: Mr. W.Scott, N. Bielby, S.Dolman, I.Donchie, M.Everett, R.Fuller, R.Lang, G.Naris, C.Whaley.

APOLOGIES: J.Reid, J.Shaw.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: M.Everett summarised these. C.Whaley
 commented that E.Urquhart had been

contacted but was not interested in playing for Gargunnock.

Dollar Academy had kindly allowed the Club a rebate for one week of the winter nets when only two people had attended.

The Crown Hotel, Kippen, had been booked for the Presentation Dinner on 28.10.2000.

Batting and Bowling trophies had been purchased, as the Player of the Year had won neither of these.

- 2. CHAIRMAN'S REMARKS: Mr. Scott welcomed I.Donchie and R. Lang.
- TREASURER'S REPORT: C.Whaley summarised the Club's financial position. He
 pointed out that subscriptions payable to the S.C.U., the

Western Union, the Vilage Cup Competition and Stirling Sports' Council were quite substantial in relation to the Club's income.

There had however been an increase in match-fees in 2000, as more games had been played due to the dry summer.

£30.00 had been received from Boroughmuir C.C. as payment for use of the ground.

Mr. Scott stated that he was not keen for this kind of let to be repeated. Any requests for the use of Meiklewood that cropped up during the season were to be referred to him.

SUBSCRIPTIONS: C.Whaley proposed that the existing level of subscriptions should be maintained in 2001. This was unanimously agreed. It was pointed out that the provision of teas and after-match drinks for the opposition was quite expensive.

DRIVERS' EXPENSES: There was some discussion of this topic; it was generally felt that passengers should make informal arrangements with their driver, and that a note to this effect should be included with the letter requesting payment of subscriptions. There were difficulties however, in the case of drivers who found themselves regularly transporting juniors to away matches. It was agreed that this subject should be discussed again at the April meeting.

4. MATCH SECRETARY'S REPORT: M.Everett suggested that the policy of trying to obtain fixtures in the east of Scotland seemed to have worked well, and it was agreed that this should be repeated if possible.

There was some discussion of the cost of entering the Village Cup (£30.00), and a suggestion that the Small Clubs' Cup might be preferable, but there was general agreement that the Club should stay in the Village competition.

It was suggested that fixtures against Doune were too frequent, and should be confined to Wednesdays. This was agreed. There was also a feeling that Clackmannanshire fielded teams that were too strong in the Wednesday fixtures, and that Kipten should not field the County Pro.! There was some discussion of the number of fixtures in September, and it was agreed that if possible, home matches should be played on Sundays only.

5. TEAM SECRETARY'S REPORT: N.Bielby commented on the improved playing strength brought about by the recruitment of the four players from the southern hemisphere, and the physical development of the Club's younger players.
I.Donchie stated that he would try to recruit more overseas players from Scottish Amicable.
S.Dolman remarked that the St. Modan's professional, Glen Rogers, was willing to play for

Gargunnock on Sundays.

It was agreed that N.Bielby would put a poster advertising the Club in the Gargunnock village shop.

It was also agreed that the fines system should operate on Wednesdays also in 2001.

6. GROUND CONVENOR'S REPORT: G.Naris reported that the gang-mowers needed to be repaired. It was agreed that J.Shaw should

be asked to pay half the cost of the repairs to the scarifier, (£60.00) as it seemed to have been damaged during his private use .

The new rotary mower also needed to be repaired; Graham would try to do this himself.

Mr. Scott pointed out that he had paid £150.00 to get the uncut section of the outfield mowed during the season. N.Bielby stated that he would help with cutting the outfield in 2001.

There was some discussion of obtaining a grant to provide a seat for the roller.

G.Naris reported that the pavilion roof was leaking at the door to the tea-room.

The square had been prepared for the winter and the outfield cut. The covers would also be resealed.

There was some discussion of the sheet that had been used to span the two covers during 2000. Whilst this had kept a lot of water off the covered pitch, it was so light that it tended to blow away, a stronger sheet should be obtained if possible.

The square had been looked at by professionals; it needed to be reseeded, top-dressed and treated with weed-killer. A heavy roller was also needed. (This could perhaps be borrowed from Stirling County).

One sight-screen still remained to be assembled; G. Naris had little time available to do this. It was suggested that a weekend in April could be set aside for work on the ground by the members.

- 7. WINTER NETS: There was discussion of the venue for these. It was agreed that Alloa Academy should be approached, as the nets might be available at a better time, and the venue would be more convenient.
- 8. USE OF MEIKLEWOOD BY STIRLING COUNTY: In 2000, S.C.C.C. had played five

of their agreed eight matches. Mr. Scott agreed that they would be allowed 8 fixtures in 2001. G.Naris should be informed whether the matches were on or off. It was noted that Stirling County's cleaning of the pavilion was unsatisfactory.

- ELECTION OF CLUBMAN OF THE YEAR: C.Whaley was elected Clubman of the Year after a vote. Thanks were expressed to Chris and to I.Donchie for their work on behalf of the Club during the season.
- ELECTION OF OFFICE-BEARERS: All existing officials were re-elected, with the exception of I.Condon, who was replaced as Vice-Captain by R.Fuller.
- 11. ANY OTHER BUSINESS: There was some discussion of ordering shirts, jerseys, ties and caps with a Club crest. Mr. Scott agreed to supply a copy of his family crest. R.Lang volunteered to take a photograph of Meiklewood House, which was an alternative suggestion for the badge.

It was noted that R.Fuller was in possession of the Club's crockery.

MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF GARGUNNOCK VILLAGE CRICKET CLUB HELD AT THE CROWN HOTEL, KIPPEN, ON 3RD OCTOBER 2001.

1. PRESENT: Mr. W.Scott.

N.Bielby, P.Canney, J.Cross, P.Davies, S.Dolman, I.Donchie, M.Everett, R.Fuller, D.Kuhlwilm, W.McFadyen, G.Naris, M.Parry, B.Pretorius, J.Reid, J.Shaw, C.Whaley.

- 2. APOLOGIES: R.Bond, J.Crossland, P.Sutherland.
- 3 · MATTERS ARISING: a) Mr. Scott informed the Meeting that no expenses had been incurred for cutting the grass beyond the outfield.
 - b) No progress had been made in deciding on a logo for shirts etc.
 I.Donchie would scan Meiklewood House and Mr. Scott's Coat of Arms before the Meeting in April so that a decision could be taken then.
 - c) There was some discussion of the practicality of holding outdoor nets at Meiklewood. The existing nets had been repaired and resited by B.Pretorius and M.Parry, to whom thanks were due. I.Donchie suggested that a net could perhaps be obtained from Clackmannanshire. However, would a practice-night be practicable? Are the existing nets useable? To become so they would need a lot more attention e.g. cutting/rolling/moving. M.Parry agreed to supervise the net in 2002. G.Naris pointed out that nothing could be done until April 2002.

4. CHAIRMAN'S REMARKS: Mr. Scott had no remarks to make.

5. TREASURER'S REPORT: C.Whaley reported a balance of £817.13, showing a surplus of £240.00 for the season. £614.00 had been received in match-fees, and £120.00 from Stirling County.

The Dollar winter nets had also produced a small profit, and the BarBQ had shown a profit of £95.00. However, subscriptions were £100.00 down on 2000.

Subscriptions/ Match-Fees: It was agreed that there would be no increase in either in 2002, (Sunday games). However, the Wednesday subscription would increase to £15.00 per annum.

Expenses Pending: G.Naris reported that repairs were required to the mower.

Costs were not known as yet.

Mr. Scott thanked C.Whaley for his hard work as Club Treasurer.

6. Match Secretary's Report : M.Everett reported on the Club's relegation to Division 4 of the Strathclyde League. This would give fixtures against Ardrossan, Allan Glen's and Cumbernauld, as far as was known

at present. There was some discussion of the desirability of fixtures against Scottish Opera and Glamis, and the undesirability of Sunday fixtures against Doune and also Old Contemptibles, who had proved to be unreliable.

S.Dolman pointed out that the Fire Brigade had called off a remarkable 4 Wednesday matches, one as late as 5.00 p.m. on the evening concerned. It was agreed that no matches

would be arranged against them in 2002.

G. Naris requested that only 4 home matches be arranged

in September, as the square was being overused. M.Everett questioned whether Stirling County should be allowed so many matches if the result was that Gargunnock could not play their fixtures.

7. USE OF GROUND BY STIRLING C.C.C:

Mr. Scott agreed to eight Stirling County fixtures being played at Meiklewood in 2002. It was also agreed that the cost would be increased to £40.00 per match, and that a charge of £20.00 would be levied if the match wsa cancelled after Wednesday of the week in question, even if weather was the reason.

TEAM SECRETARY'S

REPORT:

N. Bielby referred to the acquistion of several new members, and to the loss of others, such as the Fereira brothers. The strength of the side was variable, tending to weak, as illustrated by the number of defeats. He felt that the Club should aim to win half of its matches. On the positive side, Junior members were improving as they grew older.

The system of fines had raised £98.00 which contributed to the drinks' bill at the Annual Dinner.

GROUND CONVENORS

REPORT:

G.Naris reported that the square had in general played well; it had not been rolled as much as in previous years. The tractor required a service, and the gangs were not working as well as they could; the mower was being stored at G. Naris's home. The outfield would have to be cut in early spring if conditions allowed, whilst the pavilion ceiling also needed to be painted, and a loose step on the the home dressing-room side also required repair. The roof appeared to be

watertight at present. Thanks were given to those who had assisted with work on the ground. C.Whaley enquired whether a new container (painted green) could be acquired to replace the existing garage. Mr. Scott agreed to this proposal on the condition that the garage was removed from Meiklewood completely. Mr. Scott also enquired about the insurance position of the mower when it was off the premises of Meiklewood. G.Naris replied that it was covered by his own contents' insurance. Finally, G.Naris pointed out that the covers had hardly been used in 2001; if they were to be of any real use, longer pipes would be needed.

Naris the Bowling Award.

14. ANY OTHER

BUSINESS:

- a) M.Everett expressed the view that the agreed policy of maximum participation for players in Sunday friendlies was no longer being adhered to. Some players who bowled eight overs also batted high up the order, whilst others did little except field. He suggested that given the age-profile of the membership, and the small number of players available to the Club, the emphasis in friendlies should be on participation and enjoyment, otherwise people would not give up their whole Sunday to travel to distant "away" venues. Mr. Scott invited discussion of this point; M.Everett was supported by S.Dolman and P.Davies, but the general feeling was that the present approach was satisfactory.
- b) N.Bielby suggested that in future years Batting and Bowling awards should be given to the players with the highest number of runs and wickets, rather than the best average. It was agreed that this matter would be discussed in April.
- c) P.Davies suggested that some new Club bats should be purchased. G.Naris agreed to organise this.
- d) G.Naris reported that a new frame for painting creases would have to

be made or purchased. The likely cost would be between £150.00 and £200.00.

e) C.Whaley suggested that a more appropriate date for the AGM would be in November, as audited Club accounts would be available by then.
M.Everett pointed out that this would mean that the Club Dinner would also have to be held later in the year, as Prize-winners were decided at the AGM, and trophies had to be engraved afterwards.

GARGUNNOCK VILLAGE CRICKET CLUB SPRING NEWSLETTER 2002

SEASON 2001: 35 matches were played, including 12 Wednesday games.

12 were won, 18 lost, 1 was tied and 4 were abandoned due to rain. Remarkably, from 6th May onwards, matches were played on all but one of the next 21 weekends.

2. ANNUAL PRESENTATION DINNER 2001: This was held

at the Crown Hotel.

Kippen, in early November. John Shaw and Graham received the Batting and Bowling Trophies, whilst Graham also received the Clubman of the Year Award. Paul Beilby and David Kuhlwilm jointly received the Player of the Year Trophy. Special awards were also made to Graham, who during the season became the Club's all-time leading wicket-taker, with 174, and Martin, who became the first in the Club's short history to reach 100 wicket-keeping/fielding dismissals. (N.B. The coming season will mark the 20th Anniversary of the formation of the Club). Batsmen still have a long way to go to overhaul John Henderson's record, as he made over 3000 runs

 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING: This was held in October, and was very well attended, (17 members

for the Club!

present). Matters to note were: Chris reported that the Club's balance was £817, including a healthy surplus of £240 for the season.

Match-fees (£2.50 home, £3.00 away; and full subscriptions (£35.00 adult), will not increase in 2002, but Wednesday subscriptions (payable only by those who do not play at weekends), will rise to £15.00. The Wednesday match-fee remains at £1.00)

Mr. Scott agreed to Stirling County using Meiklewood for 8 fixtures in 2002. The charge would

rise to £40.00 per match, and £20.00 per cancelled match must be paid, even if the reason is bad weather, if notification does not reach Graham by Wednesday.

Graham also suggested that there should be fewer home games in September,(only one each week) to allow work on the square. Work that needed to be done included the painting of the pavilion ceiling.

4. OFFICE-BEARERS FOR 2002: TREASURER: THANKS CHRIS.

Chris took over as Treasurer from

John Henderson, the Club's founder, in 1996, and since then has kept finances in meticulous order. Having decided to hand over the Treasurer's duties, Chris was presented with a token of the Club's appreciation at the annual dinner. The new Treasurer is John Cross, and SUBSCRIPTIONS should be paid to John by the end of March: (1, Moray Place, Gargunnock, FK8 3BT. Tel. 01786 860 301).

SECRETARY/ FIXTURE SECRETARY. THANKS MARTIN. Martin took over the secretarial and fixture duties from John Henderson (who did everything!) in 1995. At that time Martin was also captain of the Sunday side, which became the only side when the Perthshire League Saturday team folded. At that time he had to organise the team as well, and after so many years it's time that he was put out to grass, so there will be vacancies in these positions later in the year.

The only other change to office-bearers is that John Reid becomes Steve Dolman's Vice-Captain on Wednesdays.

5. LEAGUE REORGANISATION CAUSES FIXTURE

PROBLEMS: The Sunday League is the lowest life-form of cricket administered by the West District Cricket Association, and as such receives little attention. However, this year the Strathclyde League has been renamed the West District Sunday League, and the leagues are being reorganised into geographical "conferences" with no promotion or relegation. (So our relegation last season has no effect). The reason for this change is that some teams apparently dislike each other so intensely (in the higher leagues)

that they deliberately lose or concede games to avoid being promoted! At the West meeting, it was suggested that we should be in a Conference with Allan Glen's, Drumpelier, Monklands, Mozambique and Uddingston, although there were protests from Vale and Bute who apparently enjoy their days out at Meiklewood! The winners of the four Conferences will play off at the end of August for the Strathclyde Shield (which used to be presented to the winners of an evening knock-out cup). The difficulty in arranging fixtures arises because Clubs are being circulated to confirm that they wish to enter the Sunday competition, and Secretaries will not be notified of who is in each Conference until the end of February. Thus I have had to leave blanks in the fixture-list for league games. However, we don't know for certain how many teams will end up in our Conference; nor do we know of course, that their Fixture-Secretaries will be able to fit us in on the dates that I have left blank! This shambles comes about because to most Clubs, Sunday cricket is an optional extra of no real importance, whereas to us it's our only cricket. I will do my best to sort things out in March, but for the present, apologies fpr the incomplete fixture-list.(It is possible of course that some of the friendlies may have to be cancelled or rearranged to accommodate League games). I think that if things don't work out this year, Gargunnock should perhaps revert to playing friendlies only

DEMISE OF THE SCOTTISH CRICKET GUIDE :

The SCU

has decided to replace the Guide by a 24 page full-colour tabloid-sized newspaper, to be published three times a year between April and September. (Contributions requested!) This will be sent free to everyone on the SCu's mailing-list and to all cricket clubs. Neil is registering all our members, so everyone who has paid a sub. should get one. The statistical information about each club which used to be in the Guide will now be on the SCU website, and clubs can update their own pages as required.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF GARGUNNOCK VILLAGE CRICKET CLUB HELD AT THE WOODSIDE HOTEL, DOUNE ON 4th NOVEMBER 2002.

- PRESENT: Mr. W.Scott, (President and Chairman).

- 2. APOLOGIES: P.Canney; S.Dolman; M.Nash; B.Pretorius; J.Shaw.
- MATTERS ARISING: a) Club Logo for jerseys, etc. It was agreed that this item should be shelved due to lack of interest on behalf of members.
 - b) Outdoor Net . It was agreed that this should be discussed at the Half-Yearly Meeting.
 - Frame for marking creases; a new frame had been purchased by G.Naris.
- CHAIRMAN'S REMARKS: Mr. Scott commented on the very wet summer of 2002 and wondered whether this affected members' enthusism.
- 5. TREASURER'S REPORT: J.Cross reported a balance of £927.09, an increase of £12.92

 over the previous year. The Dollar winter nets had made a

 small loss; the broken windows had not been charged to the Club.

 Due to a misunderstanding over numbers, the 2001 Dinner had

 made a loss of £100.00. Income from match-fees had been

significantly lower than in 2001 due to the weather. Insurance costs had increased slightly. The Treasurer requested that for accounting purposes the AGM should in future be held in the second half of November. This was agreed.

- 6. MATCH-SECRETARY'S REPORT: M.Everett suggested that the revamped

 Strathclyde League had not been a success, and that the Club
 was now grouped with several clubs who had a reputation for
 cancelling fixtures. He suggested that it might be preferable to
 compile a fixture-list of friendlies against clubs who were known
 to be reliable. An alternative might be to attempt to organise a
 league of local clubs ourselves. R.Fuller spoke in favour of
 retaining league cricket, and N.Bielby suggested approaching the
 Forth Union regarding possible membership. It was agreed that
 the Secretary should contact K.Johnstone of Stirling C.C.C.
- 7. TEAM SECRETARY'S REPORT: N.Bielby reported that of 35 fixtures, (Sun. and Wed.)

 15 had been cancelled, and one abandoned. Twelve matches had
 been won and seven lost. Difficulties in raising teams had been
 experienced due to Stiirling C.C.C.'s participation in the Sunday Forth
 Union competition, which meant that County players were not available
 for Gargunnock. He recommended also that there should be no
 Saturday games in September due to the difficulty of raising teams. This
 was agreed. (N.B. was spending between 1 and 2 hours on the 'phone
 every week). Thirty-six players had represented the Club, although
 only 21 of these had paid a subscription.
- 8. GROUND CONVENOR'S REPORT: G.Naris reported that the square had been little used due to bad weather. He had reseeded and fertilised it in the autumn, and suggested that it had played better in 2002 than hitherto. M.Everett commented on the hollows that collected water on the square and

wondered whether these could be filled. G. Naris replied that this would be possible, although each repaired strip would be out of action for a long time. Also, one of the affected strips was No. 3, guite central on the square. It was also noted that the rear wall of the pavilion was rotten and required urgent repair. J.Cross offered to research the position regarding a Sports' Council grant. G.Naris suggested that complete re-sheeting was needed - possibly Portacabin supply replacement panels. The steps and railings also required repair. Turning to the machinery, G.Naris reported that it was all in working order, although there was a small oil-leak on the axle of the tractor. In the longer-term, the tractor would operate more efficiently with a new engine, whilst a new tractor should be purchased if funds ever became available. Smaller gang-mowers would also be a help, as the tractor could pull them more easily; Triple X gangs could also cut longer grass. M.Everett pointed out that the grass in the car-park area had been allowed to get very long so that our own tractor could now only cut it with difficulty; Mr. Scott kindly offered to alrange for this area to be cut before the new season.

Storeage: G.Naris reported that two mowers were in the pavilion; they would be moved to his own garage when he had room.

Covers: The covers had not been used much in 2002 as it had been too wet. To function efficiently, longer drainage-pipes would be needed; R.Fuller felt that this would make only a marginal difference, but M.Parry offered to research the cost of longer pipes. J.Henderson had informed the Club that the covers could not be sold, although they could be given away. G.Naris pointed out that the covers required to be resealed too.

- WINTER NETS: M.Everett proposed that due to declining interest from Gargunnock members,
 the nets should in future be organised by Doune, with Gargunnock players
 being allowed to attend. This was agreed. M.Everett to contact S. Macdonald.
- 10. ANNUAL DINNER: This would be held on either Friday 6th or Saturday 7th December at the
