


Chapel of Garioch:

The war memorial was erected in 1919 and is sited in the grounds of the parish church. It is a tall granite Celtic cross centred with a carved wreath. The names of the dead of WWI are on the dressed front of the shaft. The base also granite is in the form of a rough dressed boulder. The dead of WWII are listed on a small block which is set into the original base. The memorial commemorates WWI and WWII, and is inscribed "*To the glory of God and in memory of the men from this parish who gave their lives in the Great War 1914 – 1919*".
