

**Drumblade War Memorial.**

The war memorial is sited at the side of the road at a junction 250m approx. due south of the school. The memorial commemorates the dead of WW1 (26 names) and WW2 (1 name). The memorial is made of rough cut granite. The top has a wreath with a ribbon carved in relief. Below this it is engraved "To commemorate the men connected with Drumblade who laid down their lives in the Great War" and the dates 1914 – 1919. Below the WW1 names it is engraved "Their name liveth for evermore". The memorial was unveiled on 11<sup>th</sup> Nov 1921 (Armistice Day) by The Marquess of Aberdeen and Temair.
