Aberchirder:

Situated in the grounds of the 'New Marnoch Church' Aberchirder is the town's war memorial which commemorates the dead of WWI and WWII. It is a tall shaft made from granite with a carving of a lion rampant at the top; it sits on a granite base carved with a sword, a sheath and a spear with the dates 1914 and 1919. It is inscribed "To the glory of God and to the sacred memory of the men of this congregation who made the supreme sacrifice for their country in the Great War".
