

Baird Facts

Region: Baird is a Lowland Clan or Family

Standing: Without a chief & therefore lacking in legal & noble status

Heraldry: The undifferenced Arms for Baird are those of Auchmedden, 1672,

currently unmatriculated

Blazon: Gules, a boar passant, Or

Crest: A griffin's head erased

Motto: Dominus fecit (The Lord made)

Badge: A griffin's head erased within a buckled black belt upon which is

inscribed, 'Dominus fecit'

Tartans: Ancient, Hunting, Modern

Septs or Vassal Families: None

Name Variations: Baard, Baird, Bard, Barde, Beard

Rare Variations: Bahard, Baiard, Bayard, Bord, Burd, Byrd, MacBard, Mackabard

It is incorrect that Ward is a variation of Baird in Scotland

By Right of Succession: In 1996 the Court of the Lord Lyon wrote that, of the two cadet

branches of Auchmedden, Saughtonhall is senior to Newbyth

At the Present Time: Sir James Baird, 11th Bt, of Saughtonhall has the strongest claim

to the Chiefship and is preparing his petition to the Lyon Court to matriculate the Arms of Auchmedden and thereby be granted Chief

of the Name and Arms of Baird
